<u>SB 808, SD1</u> <u>Proposed HD1</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS. Proposed HD1: Establishes the Drug Disposal Program, administered by the Department of the Attorney General, to dispose of prescription and over the counter drugs in a safe, secure, and environmentally friendly manner. Establishes the Drug Disposal Special Fund and appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB808 SD1 HD1 PROPOSED)	HLT, JUD

<u>SB 2350, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR3087)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Establishes a task force within the Department of Health to identify therapies and home and community based care services that may benefit persons having fetal alcohol spectrum disorders, including therapies and treatments that may benefit them as adults. Requires the task force to recommend any necessary policy changes, rule changes, or legislation to increase access to these therapies and services. Requires a report to the Legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 2506, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2913)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SPECIAL FUND. Authorizes the mental health and substance abuse special fund to be used for certain capital improvements. Requires the Department of Health to identify, among other things, capital improvement projects that should be made with moneys from the mental health and substance abuse special fund to improve the continuum of care for behavioral health and submit a report to the Legislature. Repeals on 6/30/2025. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HLT, FIN



<u>SB 2542, SD2</u> (SSCR3045) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX EXEMPTIONS. Beginning 1/1/2021, exempts medical services provided by physicians and advanced practice registered nurses acting in the capacity of a primary care provider from the general excise tax. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 2617, SD1</u> (SSCR3047) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY SERVICES. Appropriates an unspecified sum to the Hawaii health systems corporation to expand the Kau Rural Health Clinic to improve access to urgent care and outpatient behavioral health services. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 2618, SD2</u> (SSCR3311) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AMBULANCES. Appropriates funds to the Department of Health for the purchase of one advanced life support ambulance based in Makalei in the county of Hawaii, and related equipment and personnel costs. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 2814, SD2</u> (SSCR3055) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HILO MEDICAL CENTER. Makes an appropriation for the equipment and construction of a second full-time catheterization laboratory at the Hilo medical center in the Hawaii health systems corporation east Hawaii region. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 2897, SD2</u> (SSCR2987) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MARRIAGE LICENSE FEES. Amends the marriage license statute to support the Hawaii Birth Defects Program, modernization of the vital statistics system, and operating costs of marriage license agents. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 2901, SD2</u> (SSCR3060) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEARING AND VISION PROGRAM. Amends the hearing and vision program statute to increase the early identification of children with hearing or vision loss by establishing consistent protocols for hearing and vision screening and follow-up, screener training, and data collection for quality improvement. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 3044, SD1</u> (SSCR3244) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST HEALTH CARE SECURITY PROFESSIONALS. Classifies the offense of assault in the second degree of a health care security professional as a class C felony. Effective January 2, 2050. (SD1)	HLT, JUD
<u>SB 3175, SD1</u> (SSCR3016) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE HEALTH INSURANCE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. Appropriates funds for the state health insurance assistance program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HLT, FIN


