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| <u>SB 531, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR479)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO HEALTH. Makes financial exploitation of a vulnerable adult by a caregiver a Class A felony. (SD1) | CPH/HMS, JDC |
| <u>SB 2033, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2618)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE. Amends the effect of finding a defendant charged with a misdemeanor or petty misdemeanor not involving violence or attempted violence unfit to proceed. Amends the requirements for fitness determination hearings, court-appointed examiners, and examination reports. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) | CPH, JDC |
| <u>SB 2181</u> <u>(SSCR2353)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO SEXUAL ASSAULT. Amends the offenses of sexual assault in the first and third degree, when perpetrated against someone who is mentally defective, to remove the standard of proof regarding knowledge that the other person was mentally defective, as that term is defined in section 707-700, Hawaii Revised Statutes. | HMS, JDC |
| <u>SB 2311, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2379)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO CAMPUS SAFETY. Strengthens campus safety and accountability procedures and protocols, including those relating to sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and related issues, at the University of Hawaii. Takes steps to extend those procedures and protocols to private institutions of higher education in Hawaii. (SD1) | HRE, JDC |

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| <p>SB 2313, SD1 (SSCR2850) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES. Prohibits an employer from requiring an employee to enter into a nondisclosure agreement pertaining to sexual harassment or sexual assault. Prohibits an employer from retaliating against an employee for disclosing or discussing sexual harassment or sexual assault. (SD1)</p> | <p>LCA, JDC</p> |
| <p>SB 2051 (SSCR2626) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO LITTERING. Increases the maximum civil penalty for littering from \$500 to \$1,000. Increases the maximum fine for the offense of criminal littering from \$1,000 to \$5,000.</p> | <p>AEN, JDC</p> |
| <p>SB 2025, SD1 (SSCR2659) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO MEDICAL CARE FOR MINORS. Permits minors to consent to medical care related to the diagnosis or treatment of HIV or the prevention of HIV. (SD1)</p> | <p>HMS/CPH, JDC</p> |
| <p>SB 2263, SD1 (SSCR2341) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO EDUCATION. Broadens the scope of profit-making operations students can engage in at schools to include commercial enterprises. Allows students to receive either school credit or compensation when they engage in profit-making operations. (SD1)</p> | <p>EDU, JDC</p> |
| <p>SB 2038 (SSCR2424) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO BOARD MEMBERS. Permits two or more members of a board to attend state of the city, state of the county, state of the State, or state of the judiciary addresses; provided that the board members do not discuss board business and no commitment to vote is made or sought.</p> | <p>GVO, JDC</p> |
| <p>SB 2037, SD1 (SSCR2410) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO HOUSING. Restricts any county from disapproving or imposing certain conditions on a housing development project for housing or an emergency shelter unless the county meets certain requirements. (SD1)</p> | <p>HOU, JDC</p> |
| <p>SB 2130 (SSCR2327) Status & Testimony</p> | <p>RELATING TO THE STATE FIRE CODE. Amends the process for adoption of the state fire code to conform with other Hawaii state building codes.</p> | <p>PSM, JDC</p> |
