<u>HB 2128</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Makes housekeeping amendments to Hawaii's elections laws to clarify and improve the administration of elections by mail.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1751</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Authorizes election officials to establish additional voter service centers.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1752</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Reinstates the definition of "precinct" and amends the definition of "district" to facilitate the administration of elections.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1668</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BALLOT HARVESTING. Clarifies that only a designated agent can deliver a ballot on behalf of another. Prohibits ballot harvesting. Violators will be punishable under felony voter fraud statutes.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2126</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION. Establishes a process, beginning on January 1, 2021, for preregistering or registering public school- and charter school-enrolled students to vote.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2121</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RANKED CHOICE VOTING. Establishes ranked choice voting for special federal elections and special elections of vacant county council seats.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1753</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VACANCIES. Amends filing deadlines for candidates attempting to fill vacant state senate seats.	JUD, FIN

Requires the office of elections to establish a pilot program requiring candidates for county election to take the civics practice test published by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. Requires the office of elections to publish whether each candidate passes or fails the practice test.

As this is a decision making meeting only, no public testimony will be accepted.
