<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO COMPENSATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.
Clarifies how compensation is calculated for the purposes of retirement benefits. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | LAB, FIN |
| <u>SB 2868, SD1</u>
<u>(SSCR3247)</u>
<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO QUALIFIED DOMESTIC RELATIONS ORDERS.
Amendments to clarify benefits to alternate payees, advisory review determinations of Hawaii Domestic Relations Orders and the priority of multiple orders. Effective date 7/1/51. (SD1) | LAB, FIN |
| <u>SB 2402, SD2</u>
<u>(SSCR3278)</u>
<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.
Authorizes a court to order the forfeiture of Employees' Retirement System benefits of an ERS member, former member, or retirant upon conviction of the individual for a felony related to the State or county employment of the individual. Authorizes designated beneficiaries to receive ERS benefits upon the death of the ERS member, former member, or retirant convicted of the felony. (SD2) | LAB, FIN |



<u>SB 2866, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR3193)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND EMPLOYEE BENEFICIARY MONTHLY CONTRIBUTIONS. Amends section 87A-40, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to mandate that new retired employees pay their share of health benefits premiums through monthly electronic deductions from their Employees' Retirement System pension or their financial institution. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	LAB, FIN
<u>SB 2842, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR3395)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT. Revises emergency procurement laws to add equipment failures, repairs to public property to protect against further loss of, or damage to, public property, to prevent or minimize serious disruption in continued functioning of government services. Replaces approval by chief procurement officer with an accounting report to the Legislature within 60 days after the procurement is made. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	LAB, FIN
<u>SB 2843, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3323)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Changes the amounts to be posted for a protest bond from a flat fee for contracts under \$1,000,000 to a percentage of the estimated value of the contract. Increases the percentage for contracts with estimated value of \$1,000,000 or more. Repeals the cap on the maximum amount of the protest bond. Adds a sunset provision. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD1)	LAB, FIN
<u>SB 3015, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR3063)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Makes an appropriation to the Department of Accounting and General Services for the purposes of funding training, development, and consulting services for innovative project delivery. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	LAB, FIN
<u>SB 3143, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR3105)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Requires the State Procurement Office and the Public Works Division of the Department of Accounting and General Services to develop a ten-year pilot program to enable innovative methods of procurement. Establishes an exempt innovative project delivery officer position within the Public Works Division. Makes an appropriation. Repeals 7/1/2031. (SD2)	LAB, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
