<u>SB 35, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR3033)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes a pilot safe space program within the alternative learning center program in the department of education to support students by providing twenty-four hours per day seven days per week access to emergency crisis services. Makes an appropriation. (SD2)	LHE, FIN
<u>SB 2295, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2893)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SERVICE-LEARNING. Requires the Department of Education to implement a service-learning curriculum to develop student character, values, self-esteem, civic responsibility, and knowledge of local community issues and concerns through community service volunteer work. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	LHE, FIN
<u>SB 2262, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2900)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD. Amends the powers and duties of the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board to authorize the issuance of certificates for teachers at private schools. (SD1)	LHE, FIN
<u>SB 2485, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2914)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Broadens the purposes for which indirect costs incurred by the Department of Education, State Public Charter School Commission, or a charter authorizer from federal grants may be reimbursed. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	LHE, FIN

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


PAPER: 5 copies (including an original) to Room 304 in the State Capitol;
