<u>HB 1794</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DISASTER RELIEF. Extends the lapse date of the appropriation for Kauai flooding disaster relief made by Act 12, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, to June 30, 2021.	PVM, FIN
<u>HB 1935</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE MILITARY. Establishes a task force to evaluate the economic impact of the military's presence in Hawaii.	PVM, FIN
<u>HB 1914</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS. Requires the Civil Defense Agency of the County of Hawaii, Department of Emergency Management of the City and County of Honolulu, Emergency Management Agency of the County of Kauai, Emergency Management Agency of the County of Maui, Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, and University of Hawaii to each hire one full-time equivalent outreach, education, or volunteerism specialist to conduct disaster preparedness outreach and education initiatives. Appropriates moneys.	PVM, FIN
<u>HB 2329</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY. Establishes the hazard mitigation special fund for the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency.	PVM, FIN
<u>HB 2331</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT. Establish a Long-term Recovery Authority to work with the State Disaster Recovery Coordinator in enhancing the capacity of the government, relevant agencies, and the community to recover from the impacts of disasters and build resilience and sustainability in the State. <u>HB 2332</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STATEWIDE INTEROPERABLE PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS. <del>Establishes a Statewide Interoperable Communications Executive Committee for public safety communications and the position of the Statewide Interoperable Communications Coordinator.</del>	PVM, FIN
<u>HB 1947</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WORLD WAR II COMMEMORATION. Appropriates funds for programs, ceremonies, and activities commemorating the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II.	PVM, FIN
<u>HB 2478</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEMORIALS. Appropriates funds for the planning and design of a memorial to honor service members of the recent conflicts in the Persian Gulf, Iraq, Afghanistan, and the various theaters of the Global War on Terrorism, to be located at the Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery in Kaneohe, on the island of Oahu, and replicas of the memorial to be located at state veterans' cemeteries statewide.	PVM, FIN
