Requires the director to include in the report regarding the death that is submitted to the governor the decedent's name and a description of the circumstances and cause of death of the individual. <u>SB 2887, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR3317)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT. Requires statewide inventories of hospitals, dialysis centers, and medical facilities; satellite phones; and generators to provide backup power. Appropriates funds for positions related to emergency response planning and allocation of resources and for non-perishable food in natural disasters. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	PVM, FIN
<u>SB 3073, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3327)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WORLD WAR II COMMEMORATION. Appropriates funds for programs, ceremonies, and activities commemorating the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II. Effective 7/1/51. (SD1)	PVM, FIN
