HB1928 RELATING TO DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS. HSG, WLH, FIN

Establishes the Pulehunui community development district on the island of Maui as a community development district within the authority of the Hawaii Community Development Authority. Authorizes the Hawaii Community Development Authority to obtain various forms of financial aid from the federal

obtain various forms of imalicial and from the fed

government for projects of the authority.

HB1929 RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING. HSG, JUD, FIN

Extends the deadline for the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to exercise its power of eminent domain to acquire the Front Street Apartments affordable housing project on Maui unless the ground lease is renegotiated or a new ground lease is issued. Extends the deadline to obtain land use approvals for the Lealii affordable housing project on

Maui.

HB1930 RELATING TO TAXATION. TRN, CPC, FIN

Increases the amount of the rental motor vehicle surcharge tax

from \$5 to \$8.

Appropriates funds for programs, ceremonies, and activities commemorating the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II.

HB1949 RELATING TO HOUSING. HSG, FIN

Establishes an affordable homeownership revolving fund within HHFDC to provide loans to nonprofit community development

financial institutions, nonprofit housing development

organizations, and qualified nonprofit housing trust programs for the development of affordable homeownership housing projects.

Makes an appropriation into and out of the affordable

homeownership revolving fund.

HB1950 RELATING TO AN UNDERWATER TUNNEL AND TRN, FIN

SUPPORTING ROADWAYS TO PROVIDE A MORE DIRECT CONNECTION BETWEEN EWA AND

DOWNTOWN HONOLULU.

Requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility of a private-public partnership to design, build, and operate an underwater tunnel for vehicle traffic to provide a more direct connection between Ewa and downtown Honolulu along with the expansion of roadways as necessary to maximize use of the tunnel. Authorizes general obligation bonds. Appropriates

funds.

HB1951 RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. EEP, CPC, FIN

Requires electric utilities to compensate electricity producers for

excess electricity credits.

HB1952 RELATING TO WILDLIFE PRESERVATION.

EEP/WLH, FIN

Designates all currently undeveloped watercourses and lands unsuitable for development as wildlife reserve sanctuaries for which development is prohibited so that those lands may serve as a permanent refuge to wildlife. Establishes procedures to obtain a variance to construct a structure within a wildlife reserve sanctuary. Prohibits the construction of wind turbines on mountain slopes or hillsides if the location of the wind turbine is within 1,000 feet of the center of a wildlife reserve sanctuary.

HB1953 RELATING TO THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTY-SIXTH

REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

Authorizes issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates moneys for capitol improvement projects in the 36th representative district.

HB1954 RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

JUD. FIN

Restores the conducting of elections at polling places operated by precinct officials. Repeals provisions under Act 136, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, that made voting by mail the primary and default method of voting. Repeals the establishment of voter service centers.

HB1955 RELATING TO ELECTRIC FOOT SCOOTERS.

TRN, JUD

Establishes a framework for the regulation of electric foot scooters by the State and counties. Amends definitions of "moped" to exclude electric foot scooters.

HB1956 RELATING TO TOBACCO.

LHE/HLT, FIN

Establishes a requirement that persons under 21 years of age who use tobacco at a public school or public school function attend a tobacco education course. Persons under 18 years of age shall be accompanied to the course by their parent or guardian. Establishes a related fee.

HB1957 RELATING TO TAX CREDITS.

FIN

Increases the adjusted gross income eligibility cap for the income tax credit for low-income household renters from \$30,000 to \$50,000. Increases the amount used for calculating the credit

from \$50 to \$200.

HB2017 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION.

JUD. FIN

Allows the Hawaiian homes commission or the department of Hawaiian hone lands to retain independent legal counsel as needed. Authorizes the Hawaiian homes commission and the department of Hawaiian home lands to use the services of the attorney general as needed and when the interests of the State, Hawaiian homes commission, and department of Hawaiian home lands are aligned. Provides that funds paid to independent legal counsel shall be paid by the State.

HB2018 RELATING TO TRAINING.

WLH, JUD, FIN

Mandates OHA training for additional public officials, including certain state and county officials, state judges, and state legislators on native Hawaiian history, culture, and rights. Sets 12-month deadline for completion of training from time of enactment, or time of hire or appointment.

HB2019 RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT CODE.

LAB, FIN

Requires public contractors to post a post-performance bond to cover the State's costs of curing construction defects discovered within 10 years after the completion of the contract. Requires the contractor to fully pay for the bond prior to the completion of the contract.

HB2020 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

LAB, FIN

Requires the state procurement office to establish a past performance database. Requires that the determination of certain contract awards through the procurement process consider a contractor's past performance. Appropriates funds.

HB2021 RELATING TO TEACHER HOUSING.

LHE/HSG, FIN

Clarifies that the Department of Education may construct teachers' housing on a public school campus. Requires that teachers' housing units constructed or acquired on a school campus after 6/30/2020, be rented at a low cost or no cost to new teachers employed full-time at that school.

HB2022 RELATING TO THE MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE HSH. FIN ABUSE SPECIAL FUND. Authorizes expenditures from the mental health and substance abuse special fund to be used for certain capital improvement projects. Limits the expenditures for capital improvement projects at 15% of total expenditures from the special fund and 15% of the total surplus of the special fund. Excludes projects that would expand inpatient forensic capacity at the Hawaii State Hospital from permissible capital improvement projects funded from the mental health and substance abuse special fund. RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. HB2023 TRN. FIN Provides Hawaii residents with the option of paying for the registration of their motor vehicles and associated taxes and fees on a biannual basis. Restricts the amount of delinquency tax due to the current tax due plus one year. Removes language allowing storage costs and costs incident to seizure of a vehicle from inclusion in the amount the owner of a vehicle must pay in order to redeem the vehicle after seizure. RELATING TO MINORS. HSH, FIN HB2024 Expands the circumstances where a minor may consent to no cost emergency shelter and related services to include cases where the provider is coordinating with child welfare services. RELATING TO THE DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINER EEP, CPC, FIN HB2025 FEE. Annually adjusts the deposit beverage container fee based upon percentage changes in the Consumer Price Index for the Honolulu area. RELATING TO THE RISK ASSESSMENT WORKING HB2026 WLH. FIN GROUP. Requires the risk assessment working group to meet no less than twice each fiscal year. RELATING TO DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINERS. EEP, FIN HB2027 Exempts a beverage dealer who is located in a high density population area from operating a redemption center if the dealer is located within 1 mile of a certified redemption center operated independently of the dealer. HB2028 RELATING TO THE CONVEYANCE TAX. **FIN** Adjusts conveyance tax rates for non-residents who are not

EEP/WLH, LMG, Establishes a statewide sustainability division within the office of FIN planning to ensure long-term planning, coordination, and implementation of Hawaii's sustainability goals and policies. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. AGR, FIN HB2030 Makes an appropriation to fund 1 full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) agricultural appraiser position within the Department of Agriculture. RELATING TO THE WAHIAWA DAM AND RESERVOIR. HB2031 WLH. FIN Directs the Department of Land and Natural Resources to develop and implement an emergency intervention plan for the Wahiawa dam and reservoir. Appropriates funds. HB2032 RELATING TO THE STATE SNAIL. AGR, FIN Designates pupu kuahiwi (Laminella sanguinea) as the official state snail. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND HB2033 WLH, FIN NATURAL RESOURCES. Appropriates funds to the division and forestry and wildlife to purchase firefighting equipment. RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR HB2034 THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTY-SEVENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the thirtyseventh representative district. RELATING TO NON-AGRICULTURAL PARK LANDS. HB2035 WLH/AGR, FIN Requires DLNR to transfer to DOA specified non-agricultural

park lands by a specified deadline. Requires DLNR and DOA to jointly report on the status of the land transfer. Amends the definition of "agricultural activities" used in chapter 166E, HRS.

Establishes a pilot project to plan and design an expansion of the Hawaii Coral Restoration Nursery, including improvements to the sea urchin hatchery. Requires a report to the Legislature.

Establishes a 2-year mobile facilities pilot program for the Department of Human Services to purchase, staff, and operate mobile facilities on Department of Education property to provide services including laundry, showers, oral hygiene, and food for homeless children and their family members. Appropriates funds.

HB2039 RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY TECHNOLOGIES

TAX CREDITS.

Clarifies that notwithstanding any law to the contrary or subsequent amendments to existing state renewable energy investment tax credits, a power purchase agreement approved by the public utilities commission prior to 12/31/2019 shall receive thirty-five per cent of the actual cost or up to the applicable cap amount of \$500,000 per solar energy system.

<u>HB2040</u> RELATING TO RECORDATION TRANSACTION FEES.

Expands the uses of the transaction fee for recordings in the bureau of conveyances and land court authorized under Act 120, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009. Applies the fee to all services rendered by the bureau pursuant to chapters 501 and 502, HRS. Repeals the transaction fee upon the earlier of the effective date

of adoption of rules by DLNR or July 1, 2023.

HB2041 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

Appropriates moneys to the Department of Agriculture for 3 full-time equivalent (3.0 FTE) inspectors to perform meat inspection

services.

HB2042 RELATING TO BAG LIMITS.

WLH, JUD, FIN

Prohibits the Department of Land and Natural Resources from

imposing bag limits on deer, goats, and pigs.

HB2043

RELATING TO ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH CARE. Allows an unlicensed mental health professional, working under

the supervision of a licensed mental health professional, to provide mental health treatments or counseling services to minors without parental or legal guardian consent, knowledge, or participation. Requires a mental health professional to assist a minor with completing a non-disclosure notification form to send to covered entities, when appropriate. Requires a covered entity, upon receiving a completed notification form, to maintain confidentiality of minor-initiated mental health treatment or counseling services.

HB2044

RELATING TO SEXUAL VIOLENCE PREVENTION EDUCATION.

LHE, JUD, FIN

Establishes the Erin's law task force to review policies, programs, and curricula for educating public school students about sexual abuse and sex trafficking prevention, report recommendations for the establishment of a program to educate public school children on sexual abuse prevention through age-appropriate curricula, provide relevant training to teachers and school staff, and inform parents and guardians about important child sexual abuse topics. Requires the Department of Education to establish and implement a systemwide sexual abuse prevention education program at the conclusion of the task force. Appropriates funds.

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

LHE, FIN

Requires a public school that has a career and technical education requirement relating to health care workforce development to review all geographic exception applications and make a determination whether to allow students to enroll in career and technical education programs in schools outside the Department of Education service area in which the student resides.

HB2046

RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, LMG, JUD

Designates the month of September as Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder Awareness Month to promote public awareness of the risks of alcohol consumption during pregnancy.

<u>HB2047</u>

RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, FIN

Establishes a task force within the Department of Health to identify therapies and home- and community-based care services that may benefit persons having fetal alcohol spectrum disorders, including therapies and treatments that may benefit them as adults. Requires the task force to recommend any necessary policy changes, rule changes, or legislation to increase access to these therapies and services. Requires a report to the Legislature.

HB2048 RELATING TO BULLYING. LHE, JUD, FIN

Appropriates funds for selected public middle school teachers to attend an evidence-informed or evidence-based and culturally relevant bullying intervention training session and for those selected public middle school teachers to provide training on bullying intervention to other public school employees in their respective schools. Appropriates funds.

HB2049 RELATING TO HEALTH. LHE, JUD, FIN

Directs public school teachers to confiscate electronic cigarettes or electronic cigarette products. Requires public schools to coordinate with the appropriate county police departments for the proper disposal of confiscated electronic cigarettes or electronic cigarette products.

HB2050 RELATING TO TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDERS. HSH, JUD, FIN

PROTECTIVE ORDERS, AND INJUNCTIONS.

Clarifies that the effective period of a protective order, temporary restraining order, or injunction restraining any party from contacting, threatening, or physically abusing a minor may extend to a date after the minor has reached 18 years of age.

HB2051 RELATING TO TAXATION. LHE, FIN

Provides a classroom supplies income tax credit for qualified

teachers. Repeals the tax credit on 12/31/2025.

RELATING TO THE SAFE HAVEN LAW. HB2052

HLT, FIN

Requires and appropriates funds for the department of health to engage in a public awareness campaign on the safe haven law in

the State.

HB2053 RELATING TO CIVIL RIGHTS. LAB, JUD, FIN

Prohibits discrimination against any individual in selection, termination, terms, or conditions of an internship or training program because of the individual's race, sex including gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, age, religion, color, ancestry, disability, marital status, arrest and court record, or reproductive health decision.

HB2054 RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES.

LAB, JUD, FIN

Prohibits an employer from requiring an employee to enter into a nondisclosure agreement pertaining to sexual harassment or sexual assault. Prohibits an employer from retaliating against an employee for disclosing or discussing sexual harassment or

sexual assault.

LAB, JUD, FIN

HB2055 RELATING TO STATE PROCUREMENT OF WIFI AND

INTERNET SERVICES.

Requires that all state and state funded facilities have internet computer and wireless access filters to block access to

pornography sites.

HB2056 RELATING TO TAXATION.

FIN

Makes the state earned income tax credit refundable and

permanent. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2020.

<u>HB2057</u> RELATING TO PROOF OF DOMESTIC OR SEXUAL

HSH, JUD, FIN

VIOLENCE VICTIM STATUS.

Makes consistent the types of documents accepted as proof of

domestic or sexual violence victim status.

HB2058 RELATING TO DOMESTIC ABUSE.

JUD. FIN

Provides that a court may not grant more than 2 continuances of an order to show cause hearing in domestic abuse cases, absent a

finding of exigent circumstances.

HB2059 RELATING TO CAMPUS SAFETY.

LHE, JUD, FIN

Strengthens campus safety and accountability procedures and protocols, including those relating to sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and related issues, at the University of Hawaii. Takes steps to extend those procedures and protocols to private institutions of higher

education in Hawaii.

HB2060 RELATING TO DOMESTIC ABUSE.

JUD

Provides that family courts may withhold from public inspection any record of a denied temporary restraining order or denied protective order; provided that these records shall remain accessible to law enforcement without a court order.

HB2061 RELATING TO CHILD SUPPORT.

HSH, JUD, FIN

Requires certain amounts of child support moneys collected by the Department of Human Services (DHS) for public assistance of a child to pass through to the family receiving public assistance. Requires DHS to disregard passed through child support payments when calculating the income of an applicant for or recipient of public assistance. Increases the maximum fine for an employer who discharges from employment, refuses to employ, or takes disciplinary action against any noncustodial parent subject to income withholding or who fails to comply with an order of assignment of future income to pay child support.

Appropriates funds.

HB2062 RELATING TO THE SEXUAL EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN.

HSH, JUD, FIN

Establishes within the Department of Human Services a sexually exploited children statewide coordinator and program and a commercial sexual exploitation of children steering committee to address the needs of sexually exploited children in the State. Requires the sexually exploited children statewide program and the commercial sexual exploitation of children steering committee to provide annual reports to the Legislature. Establishes within each county a commercial sexual exploitation of children multidisciplinary team to facilitate the sharing of information and to immediately respond to cases of sexually exploited children. Appropriates funds.

<u>HB2063</u> RELATING TO SEXUAL HARASSMENT.

LAB, JUD

Makes unenforceable confidentiality clauses in employment contracts when an act of sexual harassment or sexual assault is claimed. Allows employees to request confidentiality of a settlement. Establishes civil penalties if an employer requests a confidentiality agreement as part of a legal settlement or arbitrator's award concerning a sexual harassment or sexual assault claim. Establishes a twenty-one day time period for an employee to review a voluntary confidentiality agreement, and a seven-day time period to revoke consent after executing the agreement.

HB2064 RELATING TO TAX CREDIT FOR ON-SITE EARLY

LHE/LAB, FIN

CHILDHOOD FACILITIES.

Establishes an income tax credit for employers who create onsite early childhood facilities. Establishes and appropriates funds for 1.0 FTE on-site early childhood facility coordinator position. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2020.

<u>HB2065</u> RELATING TO PUBLIC SERVICE OFFICE HOURS.

LAB/TRN, FIN

Establishes the Public Service Office Hours Task Force to study and develop a plan to reduce the number of public employees that commute during hours of peak traffic congestion.

Appropriates funds.

HB2066 RELATING TO THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND

HSG, FIN

DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

Creates a downpayment guarantee program for certain first-time

homebuyers. Appropriates funds.

HB2067

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

Amends the offense of abuse of family or household members to provide for misdemeanor and petty misdemeanor penalties. Allows a deferred acceptance of guilty or no contest plea in misdemeanor and petty misdemeanor abuse penalties. Requires the Judiciary to submit annual reports to the Legislature on the number and outcome of abuse of family or household members cases. Sunsets five years after enactment.
