Title of Bill: SB 0971 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

Purpose of Bill: Appropriates funds for a scholarship program to be directed and administered by the department of education to make awards to students pursuing a degree in teaching at a state accredited institution of higher education for successful completion of one course in computer science.

Department's Position:

The Department of Education (Department) supports the intent of SB 971, and respectfully offers comments.

The Department is committed to equitable and expanded access to computer science learning opportunities for all students. A critical element of this forward momentum is to advance innovation and engagement across instruction while embracing a shared response to the growing demand in Hawaii's computing jobs.

This proposal to award scholarships to aspiring teacher candidates serves to boost interest and heighten the importance of computer science skills, knowledge, and dispositions.

The Department is appreciative of the budgetary appropriation included in this measure to incentivize the advancement and access to computer science offerings beginning in school year 2019-2020 provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact priorities as indicated in our Board of Education approved budget.

As this proposal includes the need for technical and operational considerations with institutions of higher education, we defer to the appropriate agency for additional comment.
