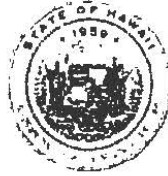

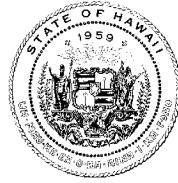

**REPORT ON THE NUMBER OF PEN REGISTER ORDERS
AND ORDERS FOR TRAP AND TRACE DEVICES APPLIED
FOR BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES OF THE STATE**

Pursuant to Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes

December 14, 2020

Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that, "The attorney general, at least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, shall annually report to the legislature on the number of pen register orders and orders for trap and trace devices applied for by law enforcement agencies of the State."

From January 1, 2020, to the date of this report, there were twelve (12) pen register orders and orders for trap and trace devices applied for. These orders were sought by the County of Maui law enforcement.
