REPORT ON SECTION 346-57.5, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES

Section 346-57.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that the Department submit a report to the Legislature detailing the amount of, and reason for, any expenditure from the Interim Assistance Reimbursement (IAR) special fund within ten business days of the expenditure. The IAR has a \$3 million ceiling.

The following are the expenditures from the IAR through February 2021, all expenditures have been made to address the increased demand for cash assistance for the General Assistance program during the current COVID pandemic.

The General Assistance Program provides cash assistance for adults with temporary disabilities, without dependent minor children. Since the COVID-19 pandemic was declared, recipient cases have increased **30%** since February 2020. The chart below shows the monthly case numbers.

Due to the sustained caseload DHS currently has a pending request for an emergency appropriation for State Fiscal Year 2021 for \$5.4 million. DHS projects caseloads will continue to remain at high levels through the next biennium, and have included in the executive budget, requests to increase the General Assistance program appropriation by \$5.4 million for each year of the biennium.
