

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1	SECTION 3. The sums hereinabove may be paid to the
2	respective persons, or for the satisfaction or settlement of the
3	respectively identified cases, and in several amounts
4	hereinabove set forth or in lesser amounts deemed appropriate,
5	upon checks issued by the comptroller; provided that departments
6	shall obtain the approval of the attorney general before payment
7	of any claim may be made.
8	SECTION 4. Notwithstanding the sums hereinabove stated as
9	interest upon judgments against the State, payment of interest
10	shall be limited to the period from the date of judgment, if
11	applicable, to thirty days after the effective date of this Act,
12	as provided in section 662-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for those
13	cases to which the statute applies.
14	SECTION 5. All unexpended and unencumbered balances of the
15	appropriations made in this Act as of the close of business on
16	June 30, 2022, shall lapse.
17	SECTION 6. If any provision of this Act, or the
18	application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
19	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
20	applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the

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invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
of this Act are severable.

3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
