ACT 141 H.B. NO.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LITTER CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the release of
- 2 balloons inflated with lighter-than-air gases poses a danger and
- 3 nuisance to the environment, particularly to wildlife and marine
- 4 animals. Many animals are attracted to the bright colors of
- 5 balloons and mistake them for food, which can cause an animal
- 6 severe injury or death. Animals are often found entangled in
- 7 balloon strings and, as a result, are injured or strangled to
- 8 death. The legislature further finds that several states,
- including California, Connecticut, Florida, New Jersey, 9
- 10 Tennessee, and Virginia, as well as numerous counties in other
- 11 states, have prohibited the release of balloons inflated with
- 12 lighter-than-air gases.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the intentional
- release of balloons inflated with gas that is lighter than air. 14
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 339, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 17 and to read as follows:
