A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KOKE'E STATE PARK ADVISORY COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the coronavirus disease 2019 has had a catastrophic impact on the world economy. 2 The complexities of dealing with a worldwide health crisis have 3 added additional layers of uncertainty that may increase the 4 time needed for recovery. Because of this, the State has 5 6 implemented the fiscal biennium 2021-2023 program review to 7 identify ways to: 8 (1) Reduce expenditures; Identify programs, functions, and activities for 9 (2) 10 possible elimination that, although well-intentioned, 11 are of marginal benefit, low performing, or of lesser 12 priority; and 13 (3) Identify cost-saving opportunities in core and primary programs and services through tightening program 14 eligibility, reducing program benefits, improving 15 efficiency, or shifting costs. 16

- 1 The department of land and natural resources, after
- 2 thorough review and much scrutiny, has determined that the Koke'e
- 3 state park advisory council, established under section 171-8.5,
- 4 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to review and assist in updating and
- 5 revising the Koke'e state park master plan, has fulfilled its
- 6 purpose as the Koke'e state park master plan was completed in
- 7 2014. The department of land and natural resources reported
- 8 that the Koke'e state park advisory council has not met for over
- 9 five years.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to repeal section 171-8.5,
- 11 Hawaii Revised Statutes, establishing the Koke'e state park
- 12 advisory council.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 171-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 repealed.
- 15 ["[\$171-8.5 Koke'e state park advisory council.] (a)
- 16 There is established a Koke'e state park advisory council, to be
- 17 placed within the department of land and natural resources for
- 18 administrative purposes only. The advisory council shall
- 19 consist of nine voting members appointed in equal numbers by the
- 20 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives and the

3	(d)	The voting members of the advisory council shall be	
4	Kaua'i re s	vidents and shall possess general knowledge of at least	
5	one of the four strategic areas listed below:		
6	(1)	Education;

9	(4)	Native plants, animals, and ecosystems.	
10	(c)	The ex officio nonvoting members shall be as follows:	
11	(1)	A representative of the United States Fish and	
12		Wildlife Service;

14		resources forestry and wildlife division, as	
15		designated by the chairperson of the board of land and	
16		natural resources;	
17	(3)	A representative of the department of land and natural

1	(4) A representative of the county of kaual, as designated	
2	by the Kauai county council.	
3	(d) The voting members of the advisory council shall serve	
4	not more than two consecutive three year terms, with each term	
5	beginning on July 1; provided that the initial terms of the	
6	appointed members that commence after June 30, 2008, shall be	
7	staggered as follows:	
8	(1) Three members to serve three year terms;	
9	(2) Three members to serve two year terms; and	
10	(3) Three members to serve a one year term.	
11	For the initial appointments, the governor, the president	
12	of the senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives	
13	shall designate each of their appointees to serve a one, two, or	
14	three year term.	
15	(e) The members of the advisory council shall not receive	
16	compensation for their services but shall be reimbursed for	
17	expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in their duties	
18	relating to the council:	
19	(f) A-chairperson shall be elected annually by the	
20	advisory council from among the council's voting members:	

1 provided that no member may serve as chairperson for more than 2 two consecutive years. 3 (g) Five voting members of the advisory council shall constitute a quorum to do business and any action taken by the 4 5 advisory council shall be validated by a simple majority of the 6 quorum. 7 (h) The advisory council's responsibilities shall include: 8 (1) Reviewing and assisting in updating and revising the 9 Koke'e state park master plan; 10 (2) Advising and assisting in the management of the Koke'e 11 recreational cabin leases; 12 (3) Enhancing community education and cultural awareness 13 of Koke'e state park; 14 (4) Participating in the protection and preservation of 15 Koke'e state park's natural and cultural resources; and 16 (5) Advising and assisting in the overall implementation 17 of the Koke'e state park master plan."] 18 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 20
