# A BILL FOR AN ACT

ACT 1 57

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a gap exists between 2 the skills that students in the State have upon graduation from 3 high school and the skills that employers in the State are seeking. Business leaders in Hawaii's expanding industries 4 report that it is often difficult to recruit local applicants 5 who have fieldssary skills and experiences. " 6

7 The legislature further finds that educational programs specializing in career readiness and technical skills can be 8 9 effective in preparing students in Hawaii to enter the State's Educational initiatives at schools within the State 10 job market. 11 have been established to develop students' technical skills and 12 prepare them to enter the workforce.

13 The purpose of this Act is to establish a statewide policy that supports those students who want to receive career and 14 technical skills education. To effectuate this statewide 15 policy, this Act supports the expansion of the numbers of 16 students receiving career and technical skills education by 17

2	outside of the service area in which those students reside.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to part IV, subpart C, to be
5	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
6	"§302A- Career and technical education programs;
7	enrollment. (a) Any school having a career and technical
8	education program shall enroll all students who submit a timely
9	application for participation in the program and who:
10	(1) Reside within the school's service area;
11	(2) Were enrolled in the school during the previous school
12	year; or
13	(3) Reside outside the school's service area;
14	provided that if enrolling all students pursuant to paragraphs
15	(1), (2), and (3) will cause the enrollment of the school to
16	exceed the capacity of a program, class, grade level, or
17	building, the school shall enroll all students described in
18	paragraphs (1) and (2) and fill any remaining capacity of the
19	program, class, grade level, or building by selecting eligible
20	students described in paragraph (3) through a lottery system.

3	SECTION 3. Section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

6	""Career and technical education program" means a program
7	operated by a school that primarily focuses on learning and
8	skill development in students through the practical application
9	of academic and technical skills and knowledge."
10	SECTION 4. Section 302A-1143, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended to read as follows:
12	"§302A-1143 Attending school in what service area. A
13	person of school age shall be required to attend the school of
14	the service area, as determined by the department, in which the
15	person resides, unless:
16	(1) The person is enrolled in a Hawaiian language medium
17	education program or charter school;
18	(2) A geographic exception to attend a school in another
19	service area is requested and granted at the
