A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CERTAIN PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF SUBTITLE 4 OF TITLE 12, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 183-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+] §183-5[]] General [administrative] penalties. (a) 4 Except as otherwise provided by law, the board or its authorized 5 representative may: 6 (1)Set, charge, and collect administrative fines; 7 (2)Bring legal action to recover administrative fines, 8 fees, and costs, including attorney's fees and costs 9 and costs associated with land or habitat restoration; 10 and 11 (3) Collect administrative fees and costs pursuant to 12 paragraph (2), 13 resulting from a violation of this chapter, any rule adopted, or permit issued thereunder. 14 15 The administrative fines for violation of this chapter (b) 16 shall be as follows:

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1	(1)	For a first violation, or any violation not preceded
2		within a five-year period by a violation of this
3		chapter, a fine of [not] <u>no</u> more than \$2,500 per
4		violation;
5	(2)	For a second violation within five years of a previous
6		violation of this chapter, a fine of [not] <u>no</u> more
7		than \$5,000 per violation; and
8	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation within five years
9		of the last violation of this chapter, a fine of [not]
10		no more than \$10,000 per violation.
11	(c)	In addition[+
12	(1)	A] <u>, a</u> fine of <u>an amount</u> up to \$10,000 <u>or three times</u>
13		the market value at the time and place of the
14		violation, as determined by the board, for each tree
15		or tree product, including koa, whichever is greater,
16		per violation of section 183-17 may be levied for each
17		destroyed <u>, damaged,</u> or harvested [koa] tree, or
18		portion thereof, larger than six inches in diameter at
19		ground level[; and
20	(2)	A-fine of up to \$2,000 per violation of section 183-17
21		may be levied for each destroyed or harvested tree or

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1	plant, other than koa, or portion thereof, larger than
2	six inches in diameter at ground level.], along with
3	any costs associated with restoration or replacement
4	of habitat and damages to public land or natural
5	resources, or any combination thereof.
6	(d) Any person who violates any rule adopted by the
7	department under this chapter regulating vehicular parking or
8	traffic movement shall have committed a traffic infraction and
9	be adjudicated as set forth in chapter 291D. A person found to
10	have committed a traffic infraction shall be fined no more than:
11	(1) \$100 for a first violation;
12	(2) \$200 for a second violation; and
13	(3) \$500 for a third or subsequent violation.
14	Except as provided in this subsection, the State shall be
15	precluded from pursuing further civil legal action to recover
16	administrative fines, fees, and costs, including attorney's fees
17	and costs or monetary assessment against the person fined under
18	this subsection.
19	[(d)] <u>(e)</u> Any criminal [prosecution] action against a
20	person for any violation of this chapter or any rule adopted
21	thereunder shall not be deemed to preclude the State from

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1	[recovering additional] pursuing civil legal action to recover
2	administrative fines, fees, and costs, including attorney's fees
3	and $costs[-]$ or monetary assessments against that person. Any
4	civil legal action against a person to recover administrative
5	fines, fees, and costs, including attorney's fees and costs or
6	monetary assessments, for any violation of this chapter or any
7	rule adopted thereunder shall not be deemed to preclude the
8	State from pursuing any criminal action against that person.
9	[-(e)] (f) No person shall be sanctioned pursuant to this
10	section for the exercise of native Hawaiian gathering rights and
11	traditional cultural practices as authorized by law or as
12	permitted by the department pursuant to article $[xii, XII, XII]$
13	section 7 <u>,</u> of the [Hawaii] state constitution.
14	$\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$ (g) The department shall submit an annual report
15	outlining the revenues generated by the penalties to the
16	legislature [at least] <u>no later than</u> twenty days [before] <u>prior</u>
17	to the convening of each regular session."
18	SECTION 2. Section 183-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	"§183-18 Criminal penalties. [Any person-who-violates
21	section 183-17, upon conviction thereof, is guilty of a

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1	misdemeand	or and shall be fined not more than \$2,000 or
2	imprisone	d not more than one year, or both. In addition to any
3	other pen a	alty imposed under this section, a fine of up to \$2,000
4	shall be	levied for each tree illegally destroyed or harvested
5	under see	tion 183–17.] (a) Unless otherwise specified, any
6	person who	o violates a provision of this part or a rule adopted
7	pursuant	to this part shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
8	Authorize	d employees of the department acting within the scope
9	of employ	ment shall not be subject to the penalty provided for
10	in this s	ection. A person convicted of violating a provision of
11	this part	or a rule adopted pursuant to this part shall be
12	sentenced	, without the possibility of suspension of sentence, as
13	follows:	
14	(1)	A mandatory fine of no less than \$100, or imprisonment
15		of no more than thirty days, or both, for a first
16		offense, or any offense not preceded within a
17		five-year period by a conviction for a prior offense;
18	(2)	A mandatory fine of no less than \$500, or by
19		imprisonment of no more than thirty days, or both, for
20		an offense that occurs within five years of a
21		conviction for a prior offense; and

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1	(3) A mandatory fine of \$1,000, or imprisonment of no more
2	than thirty days, or both, for an offense that occurs
3	within five years of two or more convictions for prior
4	offenses.
5	For purposes of this subsection, "offense" means a violation of
6	any provision of this part or any rules adopted pursuant
7	thereto.
8	(b) A person who is convicted of violating section 183-17
9	is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined no more than
10	\$2,000, or imprisoned no more than one year, or both."
11	SECTION 3. Section 183-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	repealed.
13	[" §183-4 General penalty. Any person-violating any of the
14	provisions of chapters 183 to 185, for which violation a penalty
15	is not otherwise provided, or violating any rule or regulation
16	of the department of land and natural resources, and any master
17	of any vessel which brings into the State any article which the
18	department shall-at-any time prohibit-from-being imported into
19	the State, and the master of any vessel from which is landed any
20	article required in chapters 183-to 185 to be inspected, before
21	the master has received a permit to land the articles from the

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1	department-or-its officer or inspector, as in such chapters
2	provided, shall be fined not more than \$500."]
3	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5	begun before its effective date.
6	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
