A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DISCLOSURE OF VITAL STATISTICS RECORDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to:
2	(1) Enable the department of health to disclose vital
3	statistics records for public health purposes; and
4	(2) Update the categories of those who may access
5	otherwise confidential vital statistics records.
6	SECTION 2. Section 338-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to read as follows:

8 "§338-18 Disclosure of records. (a) To protect the 9 integrity of vital statistics records, to ensure their proper 10 use, and to ensure the efficient and proper administration of 11 the vital statistics system, it shall be unlawful for any person 12 to permit inspection of, or to disclose information contained in 13 vital statistics records, or to copy or issue a copy of all or 14 part of any [such] record, except as authorized by this part or 15 [by] in a manner consistent with rules adopted by the department 16 of health.

7	statistics record:			
8	(1)	The registrant;		
9	(2)	The spouse of the registrant;		
10	(3)	A parent of the registrant;		
11	(4)	A descendant of the registrant;		
12	(5)	A person having a common ancestor with the registrant;		
13	(6)	A legal guardian of the registrant;		
14	(7)	A person or agency acting on behalf of the registrant;		
15	(8)	A personal representative or trustee of the		
16		registrant's estate[;] <u>or trust;</u>		
17	(9)	A person whose right to inspect or obtain a certified		
18		copy of the record is established by an order of a		
19		court of competent jurisdiction;		
20	(10)	Adoptive parents who have filed a petition for		
21		adoption and who need to determine the death of one or

1	more of the prospective adopted child's natural or		
2		legal parents;	
3	(11)	A person who needs to determine the marital status of	
4		a former spouse [in order] to determine the payment of	
5		alimony;	
6	(12)	A person, agency, or a beneficiary of a will or trust	
7		who needs to determine the death of a [nonrelated] co-	
8		owner of property [purchased under a joint tenancy	
9		agreement; and	
10	(13)	A person who needs a death certificate for the	
11		determination of payments under a credit insurance	
12		policy.]; and	
13	(13)	A person or agency who seeks access to vital	
14		statistics records for a public health purpose, as	
15		reviewed by the department of health's institutional	
16		review committee and approved by the director of	
17		health.	
18	(c)	The department of health may permit the use [+]of[+]	
19	the data	contained in public health [statistical] <u>statistics</u>	
20	records for research purposes only, but no identifying use		
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21 thereof shall be made.

1 Index data consisting of name and sex of the (d)2 registrant, type of vital event, and such other data as the director may authorize shall be made available to the public. 3 The department of health may permit persons working on 4 (e) 5 genealogy projects access to microfilm or other copies of vital records of events that occurred more than [seventy-five] one 6 7 hundred fifteen years [prior to] before the current year. 8 [(f) Subject to this section, the department may direct 9 its local agents to make a return upon filing of birth, death, 10 and fetal death certificates with them, of certain data shown to federal, state, territorial, county, or municipal agencies. 11 12 Payment by these agencies for these services may be made as the 13 department shall direct. 14 (g) (f) The department of health shall not issue a 15 verification in lieu of a certified copy of any [such] record, 16 or any part thereof, unless it is satisfied that the applicant 17 requesting a verification is: 18 (1) A person who has a direct and tangible interest in the 19 record but requests a verification in lieu of a 20 certified copy;

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A [governmental] government agency that, for a 1 (2)legitimate government purpose, maintains and needs to 2 3 update official lists of persons in the ordinary course of the agency's activities. Notwithstanding 4 other provisions of this section, upon request from a 5 [governmental] government agency of the State [of 6 Hawaii] or its political subdivisions, the department 7 8 of health may further disclose to that [governmental] government agency the date of the vital event that has 9 10 been verified;

A [governmental agency, or] government, private, 11 (3) social, or educational agency or organization that 12 13 seeks confirmation of a certified copy of any [such] record submitted in support of or information provided 14 about a vital event relating to any [such] record and 15 contained in an official application made in the 16 17 ordinary course of the agency's or organization's activities by an individual seeking employment with, 18 19 entrance to, or the services or products of the agency 20 or organization;

A private or government attorney who seeks to confirm 1 (4)information about a vital event relating to any [such] 2 3 record that was acquired during the course of or for purposes of legal proceedings; or 4 5 (5) An individual employed, endorsed, or sponsored by a 6 [qovernmental agency, or] government, private, social, 7 or educational agency or organization who seeks to 8 confirm information about a vital event relating to 9 preparation of reports or publications by the agency 10 or organization for research or educational purposes. 11 (g) For the purposes of this section, "research purposes" 12 shall be limited to those purposes that have been reviewed by 13 the department of health's institutional review committee and 14 approved by the department of health's institutional review 15 committee and the director of health." SECTION 3. Section 338-18.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 17 repealed. 18 ["[\$338-18.5] Sharing of vital statistics records with 19 department of health program employees for approved research 20 purposes. (a) Notwithstanding section 338-18, the department 21 may disclose public health statistics records to persons who are

11		to-use additional specified information in the record.			
12	Upon confirmation of informed consent, the additional				
13		specified information in the record may be disclosed			
14		and-used for approved research purposes; and			
15	(2)	Information in the record as approved by the			
16		institutional review committee without informed			
17		consent of persons identified in the record; provided			
18		that the institutional review committee:			
19		(A) Identifies the information in the record for			
20		which disclosure is sought;


