# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE REPORTS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 11-340, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

"(c) Subsection (b) notwithstanding, if a candidate committee does not file the ~~[second]~~ preliminary primary report that is due ten calendar days prior to a primary, initial special, or initial nonpartisan election, or the preliminary general report~~[7]~~ that is due ten calendar days prior to a general, subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan election; or if a noncandidate committee does not file the preliminary primary report that is due ten calendar days prior to a primary, special, or nonpartisan election, or the ~~[second]~~ preliminary general report that is due ten calendar days prior to a general election by the due date, the fine, if assessed, shall not exceed \$300 per day; provided that, in aggregate:

- (1) The fine shall not exceed twenty-five per cent of the total amount of contributions or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period covered by the report; and



1 (2) The minimum fine, if assessed, shall be \$300."

2 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that  
3 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were  
4 begun before its effective date.

5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
