The University of Hawai'i Professional Assembly and the employer have reached an agreement concerning collective bargaining (CB) for Unit 7. Notification of ratification of the CB agreement was issued on April 22, 2021. The only cost items are for Employer-Union Trust Fund contributions. In accordance with Section 89-10(b), cost items must be submitted to the Legislature for appropriation. The following summary of the included and excluded requirements of the settlement for the current fiscal biennium are being transmitted to the Legislature for authorization:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:
