A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOILER AND ELEVATOR SAFETY LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 397-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
- 3 inserted and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Amusement ride" means a mechanically or electrically
- 5 operated device designed to carry passengers in various modes
- 6 and used for entertainment and amusement.
- 7 "Permit to operate" means a certificate issued by the
- 8 department that indicates that the pressure retaining item,
- 9 amusement ride, or elevator and kindred equipment has met the
- 10 required safety inspection and tests required by this chapter
- 11 and rules adopted under this chapter, and that required fees
- 12 have been paid as set forth in this chapter.
- "Pressure retaining item" means a boiler, pressure
- 14 vessel, or pressure system."
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 397-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 17 "(a) Administration.

1	(1)	The department shall establish a boiler and elevator
2		inspection branch for the enforcement of the rules
3		adopted under this chapter and other duties as
4		assigned;
5	(2)	The department shall:
6		(A) Implement and enforce the requirements of this
7		chapter; and
8		(B) Keep adequate and complete records of the type,
9		size, location, identification data, and
10		inspection findings for [boilers, pressure
11		systems, pressure retaining items, amusement
12		rides, and elevators and kindred equipment
13		required to be inspected pursuant to this
14		chapter;
15	(3)	The department shall formulate definitions and adopt
16		and enforce standards and rules pursuant to chapter 91
17		that may be necessary for carrying out this chapter;
18	(4)	Emergency temporary standards may be adopted without
19		conforming to chapter 91 and without hearings to take
20		immediate effect upon giving public notice of the
21		emergency temporary standards or upon another date

1		that may be specified in the notice. An emergency
2		temporary standard may be adopted, if the director
3		determines:
4		(A) That the public or individuals are exposed to
5		grave danger from exposure to hazardous
6		conditions or circumstances; and
7		(B) That the emergency temporary standard is
8		necessary to protect the public or individuals
9		from danger.
10		Emergency temporary standards shall be effective until
11		superseded by a standard adopted under chapter 91, but
12		shall not be effective longer than six months;
13	(5)	Variances from standards adopted under this chapter
14		may be granted upon application of an owner, user,
15		contractor, or vendor. Application for variances
16		shall correspond to procedures set forth in the rules
17		adopted pursuant to this chapter. The director may
18		issue an order for variance, if the director
19		determines that the proponent of the variance has
20		demonstrated that the conditions, practices, means,
21		methods, operations, or processes used or proposed to

1		be u	sed will provide substantially equivalent safety
2		as t	hat provided by the standards;
3	(6)	Perm	its.
4		(A)	The department shall issue a ["permit to
5			operate"] permit to operate regarding any
6			[boiler, pressure system,] pressure retaining
7			item, amusement ride, or elevator and kindred
8			equipment if found to be safe in accordance with
9			rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91[+] and all
10			required fees have been paid;
11		(B)	The department may immediately revoke any
12			["permit to operate"] permit to operate of any
13			[boiler, pressure system,] pressure retaining
14			item, amusement ride, or elevator and kindred
15			equipment found to be in an unsafe condition or
16			where a user, owner, or contractor ignores prior
17			department orders to correct specific defects or
18			hazards and continues to use or operate the
19			aforementioned apparatus without abating the
20			hazards or defects $[\div]$. The department may also
21			revoke or suspend any permit to operate and issue

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1		an order prohibiting the use or operation of any
2		pressure retaining item, amusement ride, or
3		elevator and kindred equipment if the owner,
4		user, or contractor of such equipment fails to
5		pay any fee or fine required under this chapter
6		or any rule adopted pursuant to this chapter.
7		The order shall be rescinded when the department
8		has determined the owner, user, or contractor has
9		paid the fee or fine;
10	(C)	The department [shall] may reissue a ["permit to
11		operate"] permit to operate to any user, owner,
12		or contractor who demonstrates that the user,
13		owner, or contractor is proceeding in good faith
14		to abate all nonconforming conditions mentioned
15		in department orders and the [boilers, pressure
16		systems, pressure retaining items, amusement
17		rides, and elevators and kindred equipment are
18		safe to operate; and
19	(D)	The department shall establish criteria for the
20		periodic reinspection and renewal of the permits
21		to operate, and may provide for the issuance of

1		temporary permits to operate while any
2		noncomplying [boiler, pressure system,] pressure
3		retaining item, amusement ride, and elevator and
4		kindred equipment are being brought into full
5		compliance with the applicable standards and
6		rules adopted pursuant to this chapter; provided
7		that the period between an initial safety
8		inspection or the inspection used as a basis for
9		the issuance of a permit to operate, and any
10		subsequent inspection of elevators and kindred
11		equipment shall not exceed one year;
12	(7)	No person shall operate a [boiler, pressure system,]
13		<pre>pressure retaining item, amusement ride, or elevator</pre>
14		and kindred equipment that [are] is required to be
15		inspected by this chapter or by any rule adopted
16		pursuant to this chapter, except as necessary to
17		install, repair, or test, unless a permit to operate
18		has been authorized or issued by the department and
19		remains valid; and
20	(8)	The department, upon the application of any owner,
21		user, or other person affected thereby, may grant tim

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1	that may reasonably be necessary for compliance with
2	any order. Any person affected by an order may for
3	cause petition the department for an extension of
4	time."
5	SECTION 3. Section 397-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"\$397-5 Fees. (a) The director [may] shall prescribe
8	reasonable fees to be charged for inspection, examination, other
9	services rendered and for permits, certificates, or licenses,
10	the issuance of which are required by this chapter or by any
11	rules of the department adopted pursuant to this chapter, and
12	for:
13	(1) Inspections by the department of any [boiler, pressure
14	system, pressure retaining item, amusement ride, and
15	elevator and kindred equipment for which a permit or
16	certificate is required for its installation, repair,
17	alteration, operation, or use, and which is required
18	to be inspected by this chapter or by any rules of the
19	department; and

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1	(2) Examination of any person applying for permits,
2	certificates, or licenses as required by this chapter
3	or by any rules of the department.
4	(b) All fees received by the department pursuant to this
5	section shall be paid into the boiler and elevator revolving
6	fund.
7	[(c) Effective July 1, 2012, the fees for inspections,
8	permits, and examinations of boilers, pressure systems,
9	elevators, kindred equipment, and amusement rides shall be as
10	prescribed by the schedules in this section; provided that the
11	director may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to amend the
12	fees specified in this section.

9	amended as follows:

11	"(a) All safety inspections required under this chapter of
12	[boilers and pressure systems] pressure retaining items shall be
13	performed by deputy boiler inspectors in the employ of the
14	department who are qualified boiler inspectors and, when
15	authorized by the director, may be performed by special
16	inspectors who are qualified boiler inspectors in the employ of
17	insurance companies insuring boilers or pressure systems in this
18	State."
19	2. By amending subsection (c) to read:
20	"(c) All safety inspections required under this chapter of
21	elevators and kindred equipment, and amusement rides and the



- 1 premises appurtenant thereto, shall be performed by deputy
- 2 elevator inspectors of the department who are qualified elevator
- 3 inspectors and who are employed primarily for purposes of
- 4 elevator and related inspection work."
- 5 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Boiler and Elevator Safety Law; Permits to Operate; Fee Schedule; Fines; Payment

Description:

Authorizes the director of labor and industrial relations to prohibit the operation of pressure retaining items, amusement rides, and elevators and kindred equipment if inspection fees or fines are not timely paid. Deletes the statutory boiler and elevator fee schedule and requires the director to establish the fees by rule. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD1)

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
