A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE INTERSTATE WILDLIFE VIOLATOR COMPACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The interstate wildlife violator compact is a 2 multistate agreement that promotes enforcement of hunting, 3 fishing, trapping, and other wildlife-related regulations across 4 jurisdictions. For example, the interstate wildlife violator compact could prevent wildlife violators who have lost their 5 hunting, fishing, trapping, or other wildlife related privileges 6 in other member states from obtaining a hunting license in 7 8 Hawaii. Similarly, persons who have been punished with license 9 revocation in Hawaii would be unable to avoid this punishment by 10 engaging in those activities in another state. The interstate 11 wildlife violator compact also establishes a process by which 12 nonresident wildlife law violators can be treated as state 13 residents for purposes of law enforcement, thereby easing the 14 administrative burden on the enforcement agency and reducing 15 enforcement gaps that may allow the violator to fail to comply 16 with the terms of the citation. Reciprocity agreements such as

the interstate wildlife violator compact are an important part
 of any law enforcement effort.
 The interstate wildlife violator compact is modeled after
 the successful multistate driver license compact and nonresident
 violator compact. Hawaii is party to both compacts.
 Forty-eight states have passed legislation necessary to join the
 interstate wildlife violator compact.

8 Furthermore, existing member states to the interstate 9 wildlife violator compact have reported little to no added costs 10 or administrative burdens associated with participating in the 11 compact. The information system that facilitates participation 12 is available for free to member states.

13 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the department of 14 land and natural resources to become a member of the interstate 15 wildlife violator compact or similar agreement.

16 SECTION 2. Chapter 183D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
18 designated and to read as follows:

19 "<u>\$183D-</u> Interstate wildlife violator compact. (a) The
 20 department may enter into the interstate wildlife violator
 21 compact or similar agreement, whether in the form of a
