A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KOKE'E STATE PARK ADVISORY COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The coronavirus (COVID-19) has had a				
2	catastrophic impact on the world economy. The complexities of				
3	dealing with a worldwide health crisis have added additional				
4	layers of uncertainty that may increase the time needed for				
5	recovery. Because of this, the State has implemented the fiscal				
6	biennium 2021-2023 program review to identify ways to:				
7	(1) Reduce expenditures;				
8	(2) Identify programs, functions, and/or activities for				
9	possible elimination that, although well-intentioned,				
10	are of marginal benefit, low performing, or of lesser				
11	priority; and				
12	(3) Identify cost-saving opportunities in core and primary				
13	programs and services through tightening program				
14	eligibility, reducing program benefits, improving				
15	efficiency, or cost shifting.				
16	The department of land and natural resources, after				
17	thorough review and much scrutiny, has determined that the Koke's				
18	state park advisory council, established under section 171-8.5,				

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Hawaii Revised Statutes, to review and assist in updating and 1 2 revising the Koke'e state park master plan, has fulfilled its 3 purpose as the Koke'e state park master plan was completed in 4 2014. The department of land and natural resources reported 5 that the Koke'e state park advisory council has not met for over 6 five years. 7 The purpose of this Act is to repeal section 171-8.5, 8 Hawaii Revised Statutes, establishing the Koke'e state park 9 advisory council. 10 SECTION 2. Section 171-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 repealed. 12 ["[\$171-8.5 Koke'e state park advisory council.] (a) 13 There is established a Koke'e state park advisory council, to be 14 placed within the department of land and natural resources for 15 administrative purposes only. The advisory council shall consist of nine voting members appointed in equal numbers by the 16 17 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives and the 18 president of the senate in accordance with section 26-34, and 19 four ex-officio nonvoting members. 20 (b) The voting members of the advisory council shall be 21 Kaua'i residents and shall possess general knowledge of at least 22 one of the four strategic areas listed below:

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1	(1)	Education;
2	(2)	Cultural resources;
3	(3)	The environment; or
4	(4)	Native plants, animals, and ecosystems.
5	(C)	The ex-officio nonvoting members shall be as follows:
6	(1)	A representative of the United States Fish and
7		Wildlife Service;
8	(2)	A representative of the department of land and natural
9		resources forestry and wildlife division, as
10		designated by the chairperson of the board of land and
11		natural resources;
12	(3)	A representative of the department of land and natural
13		resources state parks division, as designated by the
14		chairperson of the board of land and natural

16	(4)	A representative of the county of Kauai, as designated
17		by the Kauai county council.
18	(d)	The voting members of the advisory council shall serve
19	not more	than two consecutive three-year terms, with each term
20	beginning	on July 1; provided that the initial terms of the
21	appointed	members that commence after June 30, 2008, shall be
22	staggered	as follows:

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1	(1) Three members to serve three-year terms;
2	(2) Three members to serve two-year terms; and
3	(3) Three members to serve a one-year term.
4	For the initial appointments, the governor, the president
5	of the senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives
6	shall designate each of their appointees to serve a one, two, or
7	three-year term.
8	(e) The members of the advisory council shall not receive
9	compensation for their services but shall be reimbursed for
10	expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in their duties
11	relating to the council.
12	(f) A chairperson shall be elected annually by the
13	advisory council from among the council's voting members;
14	provided that no member may serve as chairperson for more than
15	two consecutive years.
16	(g) Five voting members of the advisory council shall
17	constitute a quorum to do business and any action taken by the
-18	advisory council shall be validated by a simple majority of the
19	quorum.
20	(h) The advisory council's responsibilities shall include:
21	(1) Reviewing and assisting in updating and revising the
22	Koke'e state park master plan;

- (2) Identify programs, functions, and/or activities for possible elimination that, although well-intentioned, are of marginal benefit, low performing, or of lesser priority; and
- (3) Identify cost-saving opportunities in core and primary programs and services through tightening program eligibility, reducing program benefits, improving efficiency, or cost shifting.

The Department notes that the Koke'e State Park Advisory Council, established to review and assist in updating and revising the Koke'e State Park Master Plan, has fulfilled its purpose as the Koke'e State Park Master Plan was completed in 2014. The Department further notes that the Koke'e State Park Advisory Council has not met for over five years. As such, the Department recommends

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that section 171-8.5, HRS, establishing the Koke'e State Park Advisory Council be repealed.
