## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to authorize the 1 director of transportation to acquire real property for roads 2 and streets, without review or approval by the board of land and 3 natural resources. 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 264, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 6 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 7 Powers of director of transportation. (a) 8 9 director of transportation shall have any powers that may be 10 necessary for the full and effective performance and discharge of the duties imposed upon the director by this chapter or which 11 may be necessary fully and completely to carry out and 12 13 effectuate the purposes of this chapter.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the director of transportation may, on behalf of the State:
- 16 (1) Directly acquire real property to be used for roads

  17 and streets, without review or approval by the board

1		of land and natural resources, and, upon acquisition,
2		jurisdiction over the real property shall be within
3		the department of transportation without further
4		action by the board of land and natural resources; and
5	(2)	With the approval of the governor, accept donations of
6		land, money, or other property for deposit in the
7		state highway fund or for any purpose of this chapter,
8		upon terms and conditions as are acceptable to the
9		director of transportation, and not inconsistent with
10		the proper discharge of the director of
11		transportation's duties and functions or prejudicial
12		to the obtaining of the federal-aid funds payable to
13		the State without the donations."
14	SECT	ION 3. Section 171-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
16	"(a)	The board of land and natural resources shall have
17	the exclu	sive responsibility, except as provided herein, of
18	acquiring	, including by way of dedications:
19	(1)	All real property or any interest therein and the
20		improvements thereon, if any, required by the State
21		for public purposes, including real property together

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1		with improvements, if any, in excess of that needed
2		for [such] public use in cases where small remnants
3		would otherwise be left or where other justifiable
4		cause necessitates the acquisition to protect and
5		preserve the contemplated improvements, or public
6		policy demands the acquisition in connection with
7		[such] the improvements[.]; provided that the board of
8		land and natural resources shall not be responsible
9		for acquisitions by the department of transportation
10		as provided in section 264- (b)(1); and
11	(2)	Encumbrances, in the form of leases, licenses, or
12		otherwise on public lands, needed by any state
13		department or agency for public purposes [or for], the
14		disposition for houselots, or [for] economic
15		development.
16	The	board shall upon the request of and with the funds from
17	the state	department or agency effectuate all acquisitions as
18	provided	under this section.
19	The	acceptance by the territorial legislature or the
20	legislatu	re of a dedication of land in the Kakaako community

- 1 development district by a private owner is sufficient to convey 2 title to the State." 3 SECTION 4. Section 264-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 repealed. 5 ["\$264-24 Powers of director. The director of transportation shall have any powers which may be necessary for 6 7 the full and effective performance and discharge of the duties imposed upon the director by this part or which may be necessary fully and completely to carry out and effectuate the purposes of 9 10 this part. 11 The director may, on behalf of the State, with the approval 12 of the governor, accept donations of land, money, or other 13 property for deposit in the state highway fund or for any 14 purpose of this part, upon such terms and conditions as are 15 acceptable to the director, and not inconsistent with the proper 16 discharge of the director's duties and functions or prejudicial 17 to the obtaining of the federal-aid funds payable to the State 18 without such donations."]
- 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 21 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

#### Report Title:

Transportation; Highways; Board of Land and Natural Resources

### Description:

Provides the director of transportation with authority to acquire real property on behalf of the State for roads and streets without review or approval by the board of land and natural resources and specifies that, upon acquisition, jurisdiction over the real property is immediately transferred to the department of transportation. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD2)

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
