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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the purpose of Act 2 87, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013 (Act 87), was to:
 - (1) Remove the University of Hawaii president's full authority to act as chief procurement officer for the university for all procurement contracts under chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
 - (2) Transfer authority to the administrator of the state procurement office to act as chief procurement officer with respect to university construction contracts and university professional services contracts relating to construction; and
 - (3) Address concerns about the prudent and transparent management of public funds appropriated by the legislature and expended by the university for construction.
- 16 Act 87 resulted in a bifurcated procurement system at the
 17 university wherein a different set of rules and procedures

- 1 applied depending on whether the procurement involved
- 2 construction or construction related professional services for
- 3 university construction projects. Procurements for construction
- 4 or professional services furnished by licensees under
- 5 chapter 464, Hawaii Revised Statutes, were required to comply
- 6 with the Hawaii public procurement code and procedures governing
- 7 state executive branch agencies, while procurements for goods
- 8 and services were required to comply with the Hawaii public
- 9 procurement code and university executive and administrative
- 10 procedures governing university transactions.
- 11 Furthermore, in January 2016, the state procurement office
- 12 issued its report to the legislature as required under Act 87,
- 13 which documented the extensive oversight, reviews, and
- 14 coordination between the university and the state procurement
- 15 office on procurements involving construction and professional
- 16 services related to construction. The conclusion of the state
- 17 procurement office in the report was: "Based on SPO's review of
- 18 102 UH construction solicitations, UH's Administrative
- 19 Procedures, and fourteen (14) post-award Site Visits, SPO finds
- 20 that UH is conducting construction procurements in a compliant,
- 21 efficient, and transparent manner."

- 1 The legislature further finds that Act 42, Session Laws of
- 2 Hawaii 2018 (Act 42), was enacted to recognize that the
- 3 university made significant changes to its policies and
- 4 procedures, including engaging in some of what the state
- 5 procurement office refers to as "best-practices", and thus
- 6 established a trial-period during which the university, through
- 7 the university president, was given the opportunity to again be
- 8 fully in control of its own procurement. Act 42 is set to
- 9 sunset on June 30, 2021.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to extend for three years, the
- 11 sunset provision in Act 42 to allow the university president to
- 12 continue to act as the university's chief procurement officer
- 13 for all procurement contracts under chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised
- 14 Statutes.
- 15 SECTION 2. Act 42, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, is amended
- 16 by amending section 6 to read as follows:
- "SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 18 provided that on June 30, [2021,] 2024, this Act shall be
- 19 repealed and sections 103D-203(a) and 304A-2672, Hawaii Revised
- 20 Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which they read on
- 21 the day prior to the effective date of this Act."

- 1 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.
