

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GIFTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended		
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to		
3	read as follows:		
4	"§84- Gifts of aloha. (a) Notwithstanding section 84-		
5	11 or any rule to the contrary, legislators and legislative		
6	employees shall be authorized to accept a gift of aloha from		
7	lobbyists or their clients.		
8	(b) As used in this section:		
9	"Gift of aloha" means anything of value, including a meal,		
10	whose fair market value is \$25 or less.		
11	"Lobbyist" means any individual who:		
12	(1) Receives or expects to receive, either by employment		
13	or contract, \$1,000 or more in monetary or in-kind		
14	compensation in any calendar year for engaging in		
15	lobbying, either personally or through the lobbyist's		
16	agents; or

1	<u>(2)</u> <u>For</u>	pay or other consideration, on behalf of another	
2	person:		
3	<u>(A)</u>	Engages in lobbying in excess of five hours in	
4		any month of any reporting period described in	
5		section 97-3;	
6	<u>(B)</u>	Engages in lobbying in excess of ten hours during	
7		any calendar year; or	
8	(C)	Makes expenditures of \$1,000 or more of the	
9		person's or any other person's money lobbying	
10		during any reporting period described in section	
11		<u>97-3;</u>	
12	provided that	an employee of a nonprofit organization who spends	
13	fewer than ter	n hours in any month lobbying on a grant	
14	application submitted pursuant to chapter 42F is not a lobbyist		
15	if the employee does not engage in lobbying on matters that are		
16	unrelated to the grant application."

18	SECTION 3	3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
