
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to exempt
2 individuals sixty-five years or older from the renewal process
3 for state identification cards.

4 SECTION 2. Section 286-303, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

6 "(b) ~~[Application for renewal of an identification card~~
7 ~~issued after November 1, 1998, for an individual eighty years of~~
8 ~~age or older may be done by mailing in or electronically~~
9 ~~submitting a completed application and fee, if there is no~~
10 ~~change in name and citizenship status.]~~ The director shall
11 adopt rules to allow for renewal by mail or electronic methods
12 for individuals with physical or intellectual disabilities for
13 whom application in person presents a serious burden. For an
14 individual who has a letter from a licensed primary care
15 provider certifying that a severe disability causes the
16 individual to be homebound, the director shall adopt rules
17 allowing for application for renewal of an identification card

1 under this section by means other than in-person appearance. A
2 non-compliant identification card shall be issued in accordance
3 with section 286-301.5 for renewal applications not made in
4 person."

5 SECTION 3. Section 286-306, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

7 "(a) Every identification card issued under this part,
8 whether an original or a renewal, shall bear an expiration date
9 that shall be the date and month of the individual's birthday
10 eight years after the year of issuance; provided that
11 identification cards issued to an individual that will be sixty-
12 five years of age or older before the scheduled renewal date
13 under this section, shall be exempt from the expiration
14 requirements of this section; provided further that if the
15 individual is a legal nonimmigrant, the certificate shall bear
16 an expiration date that is the same as the expiration date on
17 the individual's arrival-departure record, CBP Form I-94. A
18 cardholder may renew the cardholder's identification card within
19 six months before the day on which it expires by filing an
20 application in accordance with section 286-303 and paying the
21 prescribed fee [†]established[†] by rules of the director."


