A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOLARSHIPS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 304A-504, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) Appropriations for the state scholars program shall
4	be deposited into the [f]University of Hawaii scholarship and
5	assistance special fund[+] established pursuant to section
6	[+]304A-2159[+]. The number of scholarships awarded and amount
7	of each scholarship shall be determined by the university
8	subject to the availability of funds.
9	The University of Hawaii shall offer scholarships to pay
10	for educational costs, such as tuition, fees, books, housing,
11	and other educational costs; provided that the scholarship
12	applicant:
13	(1) Is a bona fide resident of the State, for tuition
14	purposes, at the time of admission to the university;
15	(2) Presents evidence of academic excellence by meeting
16	one or more of the following:
