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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 245-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Stamps shall be sold at their denominated values,
4	plus a stamp fee of 1.7 per cent of the denominated value of
5	each stamp sold[, composed of the aggregate of:
6	(1) .2 per cent of the denominated value of the stamp] to
7	pay for the cost to the State of providing the stamps,
8	with that amount to be deposited to the credit of the
9	department of taxation's cigarette tax stamp
10	administrative special fund; [and
11	(2) 1.5 per cent of the denominated value of the stamp to
12	pay for the cost of enforcing the stamp tax, with that
13	amount to be deposited to the credit of the department
14	of the attorney general's tobacco enforcement special
15	fund;]

1 provided that the department by rule may modify the stamp fee to 2 reflect actual costs incurred by the State in providing the 3 stamps."

4 SECTION 2. Section 245-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 "§245-41 Enforcement; injunction; disposition of fines.
7 (a) Enforcement of this part shall be under the jurisdiction of
8 the attorney general. The attorney general may seek assistance
9 in the enforcement of this part from other law enforcement
10 agencies.

(b) Notwithstanding the existence of other remedies at law, the attorney general may apply for a temporary or permanent injunction restraining any person from violating or continuing to violate this part. The injunction shall be issued without bond.

16 [(c) Where the attorney general initiates and conducts an 17 investigation resulting in the imposition and collection of a 18 criminal fine pursuant to this part, one hundred per cent of the 19 fine shall be distributed to the attorney general to be 20 deposited to the credit of the department of the attorney 21 general's tobacco enforcement special fund; provided that if the

11	deposited	:
12	(1)	[Moneys received from the tobacco settlement moneys

14	-(2) -]	Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund;

16	[-(3)]	(2) Five per cent of the state general fund balance
17		at the close of the fiscal year, whenever state
18		general fund revenues for each of two successive
19		fiscal years exceeds revenues for each of the
20		preceding fiscal years by five per cent. For the
21		purpose of this section, the general fund balance at

3 SECTION 4. Section 328L-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

7 control advisory board under the department for administrative
8 purposes.

9 (b) The tobacco prevention and control advisory board
10 shall consist of members who are involved in tobacco prevention
11 and control. Membership of the board shall be as follows:
12 (1) One member of the governor's staff, appointed by the
13 governor;

14 (2) One member to be appointed by the governor from a list
15 of two names submitted by the president of the senate;
16 (3) One member to be appointed by the governor from a list
17 of two names submitted by the speaker of the house of
18 representatives;

19 (4) The director or the director's designee;

20 (5) The superintendent of education or the

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superintendent's designee;

12	special fund, into which shall be deposited the tobacco
13	settlement moneys as provided by section 328L-2(a), the
14	allocated portion of the stamp fee designated to pay for the
15	cost of enforcing the cigarette tax stamp as provided by section
16	245-26, and fines as provided for by section 245-41.
17	(b) The tobacco enforcement special fund shall be
18	administered by the department of the attorney general and shall
19	be used for administering, operating, monitoring, and ensuring
20	compliance with and enforcement of:

4	There is established in the state treasury the Hawaii tobacco
5	settlement special fund into which shall be deposited:
6	(1) All tobacco settlement moneys; and
7	(2) All-interest and earnings accruing from the investment
8	of moneys in the fund;
9	provided that of all tobacco settlement moneys received by the
10	State each fiscal-year, the sum representing the first \$350,000
11	of those moneys shall-first be deposited in the state treasury
12	in each fiscal year to the credit of the tobacco enforcement
13	special fund. The Hawaii tobacco settlement special fund shall
14	be administered by the department.
15	(b) The fund shall be used for the purpose of receiving,
16	allocating, and appropriating the tobacco settlement moneys as
17	follows:
18	(1) Fifteen per cent shall be appropriated into the
19	emergency and budget reserve fund under section 328L-

6	law, the entity based upon the proven record of accomplishment
7	of the entity in administering a similar trust fund.
8	(b) Notwithstanding that the Hawaii tobacco prevention and
9	control-trust fund is established within a private entity, the
10	department of budget and finance shall have oversight authority
11	over the fund and may make periodic financial audits of the
12	fund; provided that the director of finance may contract with a
13	certified public accountancy firm for this purpose. The
14	director of health with the concurrence of the governor in their
15	sole discretion may rescind the selection of the entity. If the
16	selection of the entity [is] rescinded, moneys in the trust-fund
17	shall-revert back to the State and shall be deemed to be trust
18	moneys.
19	(c) The entity selected under subsection (a), for each
20	fiscal year, may expend up to fifty per cent of the total market
21	value of the Hawaii tobacco prevention and control trust fund on



1	the preceding June 30, for tobacco prevention and control,
2	including but not-limited to, reducing cigarette smoking and
3	tobacco use among youth and adults through education and
4	enforcement activities, and controlling and preventing chronic
5	diseases where tobacco is a risk factor.
6	(d) The Hawaii tobacco-prevention and control trust fund
7	may receive appropriations, contributions, grants, endowments,
8	or gifts in cash or otherwise from any source, including the
9	State, corporations or other businesses, foundations,
10	government, individuals; and other interested parties; provided
11	that any appropriations made by the State shall not supplant or
12	diminish the funding of existing tobacco prevention and control
13	programs or any health related programs funded in whole or in
14	part by the State.
15	(e) The-assets of the Hawaii tobacco prevention-and
16	control trust-fund shall-consist of:
17	(1) Moneys-appropriated-under section 328L-2(b)(2);
18	(2) Moneys appropriated to the Hawaii tobacco prevention
19	and control trust fund by the state, county, or
20	federal government;
21	(3) Private contributions of cash or property; and



1	(4) Income and capital gains earned by the trust fund.
2	(f) The aggregate principal sum deposited in the Hawaii
3	tobacco prevention and control trust fund shall be invested by
4	the entity selected under-subsection (a) in a manner intended to
5	maximize the rate of return on investment of the trust fund
6	consistent with the objective of preserving the trust fund's
7	principal.
8	(g) If the entity selected under subsection (a) is
9	dissolved, the director of health, with the concurrence of the
10	governor, shall select a successor entity. If the Hawaii
11	tobacco prevention and control trust fund is terminated, the
12	moneys remaining in the trust fund shall revert back to the
13	State and shall be deemed to be trust moneys.
14	(h) The administration of the Hawaii tobacco prevention
15	and control trust fund shall be advised by the tobacco
16	prevention and control advisory board-created under-section
17	328L-6. "]
18	SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
19	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
20	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 and
21	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

year 2022-2023 to be deposited into the university
revenue-undertakings fund established pursuant to section 304A-
2167.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
The sums appropriated shall be expended by the university
of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
SECTION 9. Any unencumbered balances remaining in the
tobacco enforcement special fund, Hawaii tobacco settlement
special fund, and Hawaii tobacco prevention and control trust
fund as of July 1, 2021, shall lapse to the credit of the
general fund.
SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.
