A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that ensuring that
- 2 agricultural commodity research conducted at the University of
- 3 Hawaii that produces intellectual property that can be
- 4 commercialized is a matter of statewide concern.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by adding a new subpart to part IV to be appropriately
- 7 designated and to read as follows:
- 8 " . College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources
- 9 §304A-A Definitions. As used in this subpart:
- "College" means the college of tropical agriculture and
- 11 human resources at the University of Hawaii at Manoa.
- "Intellectual property" means the production or discovery
- 13 of new species of, or uses for, agricultural crops, flowers, or
- 14 other plant types. "Intellectual property" does not include
- 15 material created for ordinary teaching use in the classroom,
- 16 including syllabi, assignments, and tests.

- 1 §304A-B Contracts for services provided at the college. 2 The University of Hawaii shall include in any contract to fill a faculty position at the college that allows the faculty member 3 to retain, sell, or otherwise transfer ownership of any 4 5 intellectual property created, made, or originated by that faculty member, a condition that the faculty member make a good 6 7 faith effort to license or sell the intellectual property to a farmer or other agricultural producer having its principal place 9 of business in the State prior to licensing, selling, or 10 attempting to license or sell the intellectual property to an 11 entity having its principal place of business outside of the 12 State." SECTION 3. Section 304A-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended to read as follows: 15 "[{]\$304A-103[}] University to be public corporation; 16 general powers. The University of Hawaii is established as the 17 state university and is constituted as a body corporate. The
- (1) To adopt, amend, and repeal bylaws governing theconduct of its business and the performance of the

13	2 of this	Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
14	appropria	te section numbers for the letters used in designating
15	the new s	ections in this Act.
16	SECT	ION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECT	ION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.

Requires the University of Hawaii to include in certain employment agreements that address intellectual property rights a condition requiring the employees to make a good faith effort to sell or license intellectual property to a farmer or agricultural producer within the State prior to selling or licensing the intellectual property to an entity outside the State. Effective 7/1/2060. (HD1)
