A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SURPLUS MILITARY LAND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many properties in
- 2 the State are under federal ownership or control and are being,
- 3 or have been, used as military facilities. This use has
- 4 resulted in contamination to the water and soil on and adjacent
- 5 to many of these properties, or created hazards, such as from
- 6 the presence of unexploded ordnance.
- 7 The upcoming expiration of land leases between the State
- 8 and the United States federal government and the return to the
- 9 State of ceded lands requires a proactive approach by the State.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a task
- 11 force that will proactively plan for the remediation and
- 12 restoration of, and alternative uses for, lands currently under
- 13 federal ownership and control that are anticipated to be
- 14 returned to the State.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a surplus military
- 16 land task force within the office of planning for administrative

1	purposes.	The task force shall consist of the following members
2	or their	designees:
3	(1)	The director of the office of planning, who shall
4		serve as the chairperson of the task force;
5	(2)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
6		resources;
7	(3)	The director of health;
8	(4)	The chairs of the house and senate standing committees
9		with subject matter jurisdiction encompassing
10		environmental protection and restoration;
11	(5)	A representative from each of the four counties, to be
12		selected by the mayor of each county;
13	(6)	A representative from an organization whose mission
14		statement or purpose is dedicated to the remediation
15		and prevention of military debris and site
16		contamination or degradation;
17	(7)	A representative from an organization with a mission
18		statement or purpose of preserving native Hawaiian
19		traditional and cultural practices and preventing the
20		desecration of the environment;
21	(8)	A representative from the United States military; and

1	(9)	A representative from the United States Environmental
2		Protection Agency.
3	(b)	The task force shall proactively plan for the
4	remediati	on and restoration of, and alternative uses for, lands
5	currently	under federal ownership and control that are
6	anticipat	ed to be returned to the State. To accomplish this
7	objective	, the task force shall:
8	(1)	Create and maintain an inventory of all lands within
9		the State where the federal government claims
10		ownership or control, including a database of relevant
11		leases and their expiration dates and plans for
12		closure of military facilities on those lands;
13	(2)	Identify any known contaminants or environmental
14		hazards associated with the inventoried lands, any
15		environmental studies performed in connection with
16		those lands, and any required remediation;
17	(3)	Seek input from adjacent communities and appropriate
18		departments and agencies on proposed alternative uses
19		for the lands;
20	(4)	Identify lands appropriate for continued set-aside to
21		the federal government.

1	(5)	Negotiate with the appropriate federal agencies for
2		the return of ownership and control and the
3		environmental remediation and restoration of parcels
4		still under the ownership or control of the federal
5		government, and a timeline for these actions; and
6	(6)	Work on any other objectives deemed necessary by the
7		task force.
8	(c)	The task force shall:
9	(1)	Submit a preliminary report of its findings and
10		recommendations, including any proposed legislation,
11		to the legislature, no later than twenty days prior to
12		the convening of the regular session of 2023; and
13	(2)	Submit a final report on its findings and
14		recommendations, including any proposed legislation,
15		no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
16		the regular session of 2024.
17	The reports shall include status updates on each of the tasks	
18	specified	in subsection (b).
19	(d)	The director of planning shall submit annual progress
20	reports t	o the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
21	the conve	nings of the regular sessions of 2025, 2026, 2027,

- 2028, and 2029. The progress reports shall include updates
- 2 regarding the implementation of the work identified by the task
- force and any additional plans, recommendations, or legislation 3
- recommended based on new information received by the office of
- planning relating to the objectives of the task force. 5
- 6 (e) The task force shall serve until it has accomplished
- 7 the objectives of this Act or twenty days prior to the convening
- 8 of the regular session of 2024, whichever occurs first.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
