

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 302D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended as	s follows:
3	1.	By amending subsections (c) and (d) to read:
4	"(C)	The commission shall consist of nine members to be
5	appointed	[by the board.] as follows:
6	(1)	Three members shall be appointed by the governor;
7	(2)	Two members shall be appointed by the president of the
8		senate;
9	<u>(3)</u>	Two members shall be appointed by the speaker of the
10		house of representatives;
11	(4)	One member shall be appointed by the minority leader
12		of the senate; and
13	(5)	One member shall be appointed by the minority leader
14		of the house of representatives.
15	The [boar	d] appointing authority shall appoint members who will
16	be tasked	with authorizing public charter schools that serve the
17	unique an	d diverse needs of public school students. The chair

- 1 of the commission shall be designated by the members of the
- 2 commission for each school year beginning July 1, and whenever
- 3 there is a vacancy. The [board] appointing authority shall
- 4 consider the combination of abilities, breadth of experiences,
- 5 and characteristics of the commission, including but not limited
- 6 to reflecting the diversity of the student population,
- 7 geographical representation, and a broad representation of
- 8 education-related stakeholders. Members of the commission shall
- 9 collectively possess strong experience and expertise in public
- 10 and nonprofit governance, management and finance, public school
- 11 leadership, assessment, curriculum, instruction, and public
- 12 education law. The commission shall be exempt from sections
- 13 26-34 and 26-36.
- 14 (d) Understanding that the role of the commission is to
- 15 ensure a long-term strategic vision for Hawaii's public charter
- 16 schools, each nominee to the commission shall meet the following
- 17 minimum qualifications:
- 18 (1) Commitment to [education.] charter schools. Each
- nominee's record should demonstrate a deep and abiding
- interest in education, and a dedication to the social,
- 21 academic, and character development of young people

1		through the administration of a high performing
2		charter school system;
3	(2)	Record of integrity, civic virtue, and high ethical
4		standards. Each nominee shall demonstrate integrity,
5		civic virtue, and high ethical standards and be
6		willing to hold fellow commission members to the same
7	(3)	Availability for constructive engagement. Each
8		nominee shall commit to being a conscientious and
9		attentive commission member; and
10	(4)	Knowledge of best practices. Each nominee shall have
11		an understanding of best practices in charter school
12		educational governance or shall be willing to be
13		trained in such."
14	2.	By amending subsections (g) and (h) to read:
15	" (g)	Commission members shall serve not more than three
16	consecuti	ve three-year terms, with each term beginning on
17	July 1[;	provided that the initial terms that commence after
18	June 30,	2012, shall be staggered as follows:
19	(1)	Three members, including the chairperson, to serve
20		three-year terms;
21	(2)	Three members to serve two-year terms; and



1	(3)	Three members to serve one-year terms].
2	Beginning	July 1, 2021, as the terms of existing members expire,
3	a new app	ointee shall be made in the following order of
4	priority:	
5	(1)	One member appointed by the governor;
6	(2)	One member appointed by the president of the senate;
7	(3)	One member appointed by the speaker of the house of
8		representatives;
9	(4)	One member appointed by the minority leader of the
10		<pre>senate;</pre>
11	(5)	One member appointed by the minority leader of the
12		house of representatives;
13	(6)	One member appointed by the governor;
14	(7)	One member appointed by the president of the senate;
15	(8)	One member appointed by the speaker of the house of
16		representatives; and
17	<u>(9)</u>	One member appointed by the governor.
18	(h)	Notwithstanding the terms of the members, the [board]
19	appointin	g authority may fill vacancies in the commission of any
20	member fo	r which the appointing authority is responsible, at any
21	time when	a vacancy occurs due to resignation, non-

- 1 participation, the request of a majority of the commission
- 2 members, or termination by the board for cause."
- 3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Public Charter School Commission; Members; Appointment

Description:

Amends the appointing authority of the public charter school commission members. Specifies the transition from existing members to members appointed under the new appointing authority. Requires that members of the public charter school commission possess strong experience and expertise in public and nonprofit governance, management and finance, public school leadership, assessment, curriculum, instruction, and public education law.

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
