### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REPORTS FILED WITH THE CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) The candidate and treasurer of the candidate
4	committee of each candidate whose name will appear on the ballo
5	shall file preliminary, final, and supplemental reports as
6	follows:
7	(1) The filing dates for preliminary reports are:
8	(A) April 30 of the year of a general election;
9	(B) Thirty calendar days before a primary, initial
10	special, or initial nonpartisan election;
11	(C) Ten calendar days before a primary, initial
12	special, or initial nonpartisan election;
13	(D) October 1 of the year of a general election; and
14	(E) Ten calendar days before a general, subsequent
15	special, or subsequent nonpartisan election;
16	[provided that this preliminary report does not
17	need to be filed by a candidate who is

1		unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or
2		initial nonpartisan election, or a candidate who
3		is elected to office in the primary, initial
4		special, or initial nonpartisan election.]
5		provided that the preliminary reports required by
6		subparagraphs (D) and (E) do not need to be filed by a
7		candidate who is unsuccessful in a primary, initial
8		special, or initial nonpartisan election, or a
9		candidate who is elected to office in the primary,
10		initial special, or initial nonpartisan election. The
11		preliminary report filed by the date required under
12		subparagraph (B) shall be current through June 30, and
13		all other preliminary reports shall be current through
14		the fifth calendar day before the filing deadline of
15		those other preliminary reports;
16	(2)	The filing date for the final primary report is twenty
17		calendar days after a primary, initial special, or
18		initial nonpartisan election. The report shall be
19		current through the day of the applicable election;
20	(3)	The filing date for the final election period report
21		is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent,

1		subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan
2		election. The report shall be current through the day
3		of the applicable election. The final election period
4		report shall be filed by a candidate who is
5		unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or initial
6		nonpartisan election or a candidate who is elected to
7		office in the primary, initial special, or initial
8		nonpartisan election; provided that a candidate who is
9		elected and is to be sworn into office prior to thirty
10		calendar days after a general, subsequent, subsequent
11		special, or subsequent nonpartisan election in which
12		the candidate was elected, shall file the final
13		election period report three business days before the
14		date the candidate is to be sworn into office; and
15	(4)	The filing dates for supplemental reports are:
16		(A) January 31 annually; and
17		(B) July 31 after an election year.
18		The report shall be current through December 31 for
19		the report filed on January 31 and current through
20		June 30 for the report filed on July 31."

1	SECTION 2. Section 11-339, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:			
3	"(b) By June 30 of an election year, a candidate committee			
4	that does not intend to receive contributions $[\frac{1}{1-\Theta^2}]$ and make			
5	expenditures[ $_{ au}$ ] that aggregate more than \$1,000 in an election			
6	period shall notify the commission of its intent in the			
7	candidate committee's organizational report.			
8	(c) By the fifth calendar day before the due date of the			
9	preliminary primary report $[\tau]$ due ten days before the election,			
10	a noncandidate committee that does not intend to receive			
11	contributions $[\tau \to r]$ and make expenditures $[\tau]$ that aggregate more			
12	than \$1,000 in an election period shall notify the commission of			
13	its intent in the noncandidate committee's organizational			
14	report."			
15	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed			
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.			
17	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

#### Report Title:

Campaign Spending Commission Package; Committee Reports; Time for Candidates to File Preliminary Reports; Time for Committees to Notify Commission of Intent to Receive and Spend in the Aggregate \$1,000 or Less

#### Description:

Housekeeping measure that provides that candidates do not need to file preliminary general reports if they are either unsuccessful or are elected to office in the primary election. Amends subsections (b) and (c) of section 11-339, HRS, to make them consistent with subsection (a) by aggregating contributions and expenditures in determining whether a committee need only file the final election period report.
