A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REGISTRATION OF VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that some individuals and 2 entities intentionally abandon vehicles on roads and highways 3 throughout the State, and that it is difficult for the counties 4 to recoup the costs of towing and disposal. The legislature 5 further finds that if the counties were able to require that the 6 costs of towing and disposal be paid as a condition precedent to 7 registration of vehicles, the counties would have an easier time 8 recouping their costs. 9 The purpose of this Act is to allow the director of finance 10 of a county to require payment of outstanding charges owed to 11 the county for the towing, removal, or disposal of an abandoned 12 or derelict vehicle before issuing a motor vehicle registration. 13 SECTION 2. Section 286-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 15 The certificate of registration for each motor

vehicle in the counties of the State shall be renewed on a

staggered basis as established by each county. The director of

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- 1 finance of each county may adopt rules to carry out the purposes
- 2 stated in this section and shall expend the necessary funds from
- 3 the director's operating funds as may be necessary for these
- 4 purposes; provided that the director of finance, if the director
- 5 has ascertained as of the date of the application that the
- 6 registered owner has not deposited or paid bail with respect to
- 7 any summons or citation issued to the registered owner for
- 8 stopping, standing, or parking in violation of traffic
- 9 ordinances within the county, or has outstanding charges owed to
- 10 the county for the towing, removal, or disposal of an abandoned
- 11 or derelict vehicle within the county, may require, as a
- 12 condition precedent to the renewal, that the registered owner
- 13 deposit or pay bail with respect to all such summonses [or],
- 14 citations[-], or outstanding charges; provided that the
- 15 registered owner shall not be fined if the abandoned or derelict
- 16 vehicle was stolen or taken from the registered owner without
- 17 permission or authorization. The certificates of registration
- 18 issued hereunder shall show, in addition to all information
- 19 required under section 286-47, the serial number of the tag or
- 20 emblem and shall be valid during the registration year only for
- 21 which they are issued. The certificates of ownership need not

- 1 be renewed annually but shall remain valid as to any interest
- 2 shown therein until canceled by the director of finance as
- 3 provided by law or replaced by new certificates of ownership as
- 4 hereinafter provided."
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 286-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 7 "(c) Subsection (b), requiring a transferee to forward the
- 8 certificate of ownership after endorsement to the director of
- 9 finance, shall not apply to the transferee of a vehicle who was
- 10 not intending to and does not drive the vehicle or permit the
- 11 vehicle to be driven upon the public highways, but every such
- 12 transferee, upon transferring the transferee's interest or title
- 13 to another, shall give notice of the transfer to the director of
- 14 finance and endorse the certificate of ownership to the new
- 15 legal owner and the certificate of registration to the new
- 16 owner; provided that if the director of finance has ascertained
- 17 as of the date of the application that the registered owner has
- 18 not deposited or paid bail with respect to any summons or
- 19 citation issued to the registered owner for stopping, standing,
- 20 or parking in violation of traffic ordinances within the county,
- 21 or has outstanding charges owed to the county for the towing,

- 1 removal, or disposal of an abandoned or derelict vehicle within
- 2 the county, the director may require, as a condition precedent
- 3 to the transfer, that the registered owner deposit or pay bail
- 4 with respect to all such summons $[or]_{,}$ citations $[-]_{,}$ or
- 5 outstanding charges; provided that the registered owner shall
- 6 not be fined if the abandoned or derelict vehicle was stolen or
- 7 taken from the registered owner without permission or
- 8 authorization."
- 9 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

Allows the director of finance of a county to require payment of outstanding charges owed to the county for the towing, removal, or disposal of an abandoned or derelict vehicle within the county before issuing a motor vehicle certificate of registration, except when the motor vehicle was stolen or taken without permission or authorization. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD2)
