A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The current Hawaii Revised Statutes relating to 2 certification of emergency medical personnel does not address 3 emergency medical technicians who successfully complete National 4 Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians certification that is 5 based on the national curriculum of the United States Department 6 of Transportation to be qualified to perform emergency medical 7 services as an emergency medical technician in the State. 8 personnel include firefighters and ocean safety lifequards who 9 are dispatched to and are providing care to patients in need of 10 emergency medical care, but are not working on an ambulance. 11 The benefits of this Act will be that: 12 (1) The State will have some oversight as to requirements 13 and performance as it does with current emergency 14 medical technicians; 15 (2) The system will be more robust and resilient by 16 licensing an additional one thousand four hundred 17 emergency medical technicians to provide care during

1		times of urgent need including during disaster	
2		response; and	
3	(3)	This Act will not change the functionality of the	
4		current day-to-day system. This means that only	
5		current state-licensed ambulance employed emergency	
6		medical technicians will be able to work on an	
7		ambulance, and firefighters and ocean safety	
8		lifeguards must meet additional requirements, just as	
9		they do today, in order to work on an ambulance.	
10	The purpose of this Act is to allow emergency medical		
11	personnel who successfully complete National Registry of		
12	Emergency Medical Technicians certification to be qualified to		
13	perform emergency medical services as emergency medical		
14	technicians in the State.		
15	SECTION 2. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
16	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
17	and to read as follows:		
18	" <u>§45</u>	3- Certification of emergency medical technician.	
19	Personnel	with proof of current certification from the National	
20	Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians that is based on the		
21	national curriculum of the United States Department of		

- 1 Transportation shall be deemed qualified to perform emergency
- 2 medical services as emergency medical technicians in the State.
- 3 The Hawaii medical board shall provide for the revocation,
- 4 suspension, or limitation of certification if an individual once
- 5 certified under this section fails to maintain or meet
- 6 requirements for continued certification or for good cause
- 7 shown."
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 453-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "§453-32 Certification of emergency ambulance personnel.
- 11 The Hawaii medical board shall certify individuals as qualified
- 12 in emergency medical services upon application therefor;
- 13 provided that the applicant for certification:
- 14 (1) Holds a certificate from the National Registry of
- 15 Emergency Medical Technicians, has satisfactorily
- passed a course of training in emergency medical
- services for emergency ambulance services personnel
- 18 which shall be based on the national curriculum of the
- 19 United States Department of Transportation and
- approved by the board, and meets other standards and
- qualifications, including passage of an examination $[\tau]$

3	(2) Meets continu	ing education requirements which shall be	
4	set by the Ha	waii medical board; and	
5	(3) Meets other of	qualifications set by the Hawaii medical

7	The board shall direct	y review the credentials of applicants	
8	and administer required	examinations [required]. Certification	
9	under this section shall	.l be a prerequisite to the practice of	
10	emergency medical services as an employee of an emergency		
11	ambulance service.		
12	The Hawaii medical	. board shall provide standard application	
13	forms for the certification	ation of emergency ambulance personnel and	
14	[shall] provide for the	e periodic renewal of such certification.	
15	The Hawaii medical board shall assess a fee for such		
16	application, certification, and renewal. The Hawaii medical		
17	board shall provide for the revocation, suspension, or		
18	limitation of certification in the event an individual once		
19	certified under this section fails to maintain or meet		
20	requirements for continued certification $[\tau]$ or for good cause		
21	l shown."		

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 453-32.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§453-32.1 Renewal of certification. (a) Every person
- 4 holding a certificate under this part shall renew the
- 5 certificate with the board no later than January 31 of each
- 6 even-numbered year, pay a renewal fee, and comply with the
- 7 continuing education requirements set forth in the board's
- 8 rules.
- 9 (b) To determine compliance, the board may conduct a
- 10 random audit. A person selected for audit shall be notified by
- 11 the board. Within [sixty] 60 days of notification, the person
- 12 shall provide to the board documentation to verify compliance
- 13 with the continuing education requirements.
- 14 (c) Failure to renew, pay the renewal fee, and, in the
- 15 case of audited persons, provide documentation of compliance
- 16 shall constitute a forfeiture of the certificate which may only
- 17 be restored upon the submission of written application, payment
- 18 to the board of a restoration fee, and in the case of audited
- 19 persons, documentation of compliance.

1	(d) A certificate that has been forfeited for one renewal
2	term shall be automatically terminated and cannot be restored,
3	and a new application for certification shall be required."
4	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
