A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A STATE POKER COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish a poker 2 commission to oversee the licensing and operation of live poker 3 rooms and other specified gaming activities in the State. 4 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 5 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 6 as follows: 7 "CHAPTER 8 POKER COMMISSION 9 -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 10 context dictates otherwise: 11 "Commission" means the poker commission established under 12 this chapter.
- "Licensee" means a person or entity that has been granted a
- 14 gaming license by the poker commission to operate a live poker
- 15 room or other specified gaming activity.

- 1 "Live poker room" means a facility in which poker games are
- 2 played against other players at the facility and not against the
- 3 dealer or house.
- 4 § -2 Poker commission; establishment; powers and duties.
- 5 (a) There is established a poker commission, which shall be
- 6 attached to the department of business, economic development,
- 7 and tourism for administrative purposes. The commission shall
- 8 comprise three commissioners, as follows:
- 9 (1) The director of business, economic development, and
- tourism, or the director's designee, who shall serve
- as the chair of the commission;
- 12 (2) The director of commerce and consumer affairs, or the
- director's designee; and
- 14 (3) The director of taxation, or the director's designee.
- 15 (b) The commission shall oversee the licensing and
- 16 operation of specified gaming activities in the State. The
- 17 commission may hire staff such as an executive director,
- 18 investigators, and clerical staff as necessary to carry out its
- 19 duties.
- 20 (c) The powers and duties of the commission shall be as
- 21 follows:



1	(1)	Review applications and award gaming licenses for the
2		operation of live poker rooms; provided that not more
3		than one live poker room per county shall be
4		authorized to operate at any given time;
5	(2)	Review applications and award gaming licenses for the
6		operation of other gaming activities specifically
7		approved by the commission;
8	(3)	Establish, and ensure compliance with, terms and
9		conditions for maintaining a valid gaming license,
10		including safety and consumer protection requirements
11		and timely payment of applicable fees and taxes; and
12	(4)	Adopt rules as necessary, pursuant to chapter 91, to
13		effectuate the purposes of this chapter.
14	S	-3 Authorized gaming activities. The commission shall
15	authorize	and regulate the following types of gaming activities:
16	(1)	Poker, which shall be played only in live poker rooms
17		overseen by the commission; and
18	(2)	Any other gaming activities specifically approved by
19		the commission.

8		(A)	Has been a legal resident of the State for not
9			less than five years preceding the date of
10			application;
11		(B)	Is not less than twenty-one years of age; and
12		(C)	Has had no felony convictions; and
13	(2)	That	the applying entity:
14		(A)	Has been organized under the laws of the State;
15		(B)	Has a Hawaii tax identification number;
16		(C)	Has a department of commerce and consumer affairs
17			business registration division number and suffix;
18		(D)	Has a federal employer identification number;
19		(E)	Is wholly held by Hawaii legal residents or
20			entities wholly controlled by Hawaii legal
21			residents who have been Hawaii legal residents

1		for not less than five years immediately
2		preceding the date the application was submitted;
3	(F)	Has financial resources under its control of not
4		less than \$1,000,000 for each gaming license
5		applied for, in the form of bank statements or
6		escrow accounts, and that the financial resources
7		have been under the control of the applying
8		entity for not less than ninety days immediately
9		preceding the date the application was submitted;
10		and
11	(G)	Is composed of principals or members, each of
12		whom has been a legal resident of the State for
13		not less than five years preceding the date of
14		application and has no felony convictions.
15	(c) A ga	ming license shall not be sold or otherwise
16	transferred fr	om one person to another person; provided that an
17	individual or	entity that holds a gaming license may take on
18	partners or ad	ditional owners, subject to the commission's
19	approval.	
20	§ -5 F	ees. (a) Each application for a gaming license
21	shall be accom	panied by payment of an application fee, as set by

1 the commission; provided that eighty per cent of the fee shall 2 be refunded by the commission if the application is denied. 3 Upon approval of an application, each approved 4 licensee shall pay a one-time licensing fee, as set by the 5 commission. 6 (c) All fees collected by the commission under this 7 chapter shall be deposited into the gaming regulation special 8 fund established pursuant to section 9 -6 Conditions for maintaining a gaming license. A licensee shall comply with the following conditions or 10 11 requirements during the period of licensure: 12 Rules established by the commission, including safety (1)13 and consumer protection requirements; 14 (2) Timely payment of applicable taxes; 15 (3) Compliance with all applicable zoning laws; 16 (4) Each live poker room establishment shall: 17 (A) Have working security cameras; Implement a commonly accepted, industry standard 18 (B) 19 system to keep accurate records of players' 20 activity;

1		(C)	Use a playing chip that is uniquely identifiable
2			with a microchip in each playing chip;
3		(D)	Require that all dealers have a degree or
4			certificate from a professional dealer school
5			approved by the commission;
6		(E)	Require that all private security guards be
7			licensed under section 463-7;
8		(F)	Maintain a valid liquor license for the
9			establishment;
10		(G)	Maintain a valid food and beverage license for
11			the establishment; and
12		(H)	Establish and enforce written, industry standard
13			policies that address cheating and collusion and
14			the prevention of cheating and collusion; and
15	(5)	Any	other conditions or requirements specified by the
16		comm	aission.
17	S	-7 R	devocation and suspension of license; hearing. (a)
18	In additi	on to	any other actions authorized by law, the
19	commissio	n may	deny, revoke, or suspend any license applied for
20	or issued	by t	the commission, in accordance with this chapter,

1	and to II.	me of otherwise discipline a licensee for any cause
2	authorize	d by law, including the following:
3	(1)	Procuring a license through fraud, misrepresentation,
4		or deceit;
5	(2)	Professional misconduct, gross carelessness, or
6		manifest incapacity;
7	(3)	Violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or
8		the rules adopted thereto;
9	(4)	False, fraudulent, or deceptive advertising;
10	(5)	Any other conduct constituting fraudulent or dishonest
11		dealings;
12	(6)	Failure to comply with an order of the commission; and
13	(7)	Making a false statement on any document submitted or
14		required to be filed by this chapter, including
15		furnishing false or fraudulent material information in
16		any application.
17	(b)	Any person who violates any of the provisions of this
18	chapter o	r the rules adopted pursuant thereto shall be penalized
19	as follow	rs:
20	(1)	A mandatory fine of not less than \$2,000 for a first
21		offense:

1	(2)	A mandatory fine of not less than \$4,000 for a second
2		offense within five years of a prior fine imposed
3		under this section; and

- 4 (3) A mandatory fine of not less than \$4,000 plus

 5 suspension of the gaming license for not less than

 6 seven days for a third or subsequent offense within

 7 five years of two prior fines imposed under this

 8 section;
- 9 provided that the commission shall consider the nature and
 10 severity of the offense in deciding whether to impose a penalty
 11 that exceeds the minimum fine specified above.
- (c) A revocation order may include language that upon the revocation order becoming final, all gaming equipment and related supplies shall be forfeited to the State.
- (d) All proceedings for denial, suspension, fine, or
 revocation of a license on any ground specified in this section
 shall be conducted pursuant to chapter 91, including the right
 to judicial review.
- 19 § -8 Gaming regulation special fund. (a) There is
 20 established in the state treasury the gaming regulation special
 21 fund, into which shall be deposited:

1	(1) All revenues from the operations of the poker
2	commission, including fees and fines collected; and
3	(2) Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund.
4	(b) Moneys in the gaming regulation special fund shall be
5	used for the following purposes:
6	(1) Enforcement operations of the poker commission; and
7	(2) Public outreach and education efforts of the
8	commission."
9	SECTION 3. Section 712-1220, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending the definitions of "contest of chance" and
11	"gambling" to read as follows:
12	""Contest of chance" means any contest, game, gaming
13	scheme, or gaming device in which the outcome depends in a
14	material degree upon an element of chance, notwithstanding that
15	skill of the contestants may also be a factor therein[-], but
16	does not include poker played at a live poker room licensed
17	pursuant to chapter or a gaming activity specifically
18	approved and licensed by the poker commission pursuant to
19	chapter .
20	"Gambling" [. A] occurs when a person engages in gambling
21	if [he] the person stakes or risks something of value upon the



- 1 outcome of a contest of chance or a future contingent event not
- 2 under [his] the person's control or influence, upon an agreement
- 3 or understanding that [he] the person or someone else will
- 4 receive something of value in the event of a certain outcome.
- 5 Gambling does not include [bona]:
- 6 (1) Poker, when played at a live poker room licensed
- 7 pursuant to chapter or a gaming activity
- 8 specifically approved and licensed by the poker
- 9 commission pursuant to chapter ; or
- 10 (2) Bona fide business transactions valid under the law of
- 11 contracts, including but not limited to contracts for the
- 12 purchase or sale at a future date of securities or commodities,
- 13 and agreements to compensate for loss caused by the happening of
- 14 chance, including but not limited to contracts of indemnity or
- 15 quaranty and life, health, or accident insurance."
- 16 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 18 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 for
- 19 the establishment and operating expenses of the poker
- 20 commission, including the acquisition of office space, furniture



- 1 and equipment, and office supplies, and the training of
- 2 commissioners.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 5 this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 for
- 9 the establishment of full-time equivalent (.0 FTE) staff
- 10 positions for the poker commission.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 13 this Act.
- 14 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 15 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 16 begun before its effective date.
- 17 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.
