A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMAL CARETAKERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that feral cats are non-
- 2 domesticated cats that typically live outdoors in colonies with
- 3 other feral cats. The fact that feral cats have not been
- 4 socialized to interact with humans makes it impractical to place
- 5 them into adoptive homes. Feral cat colonies create numerous
- 6 problems for the cats themselves, as well as for as the
- 7 communities that find their presence to be a nuisance.
- 8 The legislature also finds that mongooses are small animals
- 9 similar in appearance to weasels that feed on small mammals,
- 10 reptiles, and bird and sea turtle eggs and hatchlings.
- 11 According to the department of land and natural resources, in
- 12 1999, it was estimated that mongooses caused approximately
- 13 \$50,000,000 in annual damages to Hawaii and Puerto Rico.
- 14 The legislature recognizes that feral cats and mongooses
- 15 have had a devastating impact on the State's indigenous
- 16 wildlife, including indigenous birds, monk seals, and sea
- 17 turtles. For example, in 2020, a Hawaiian monk seal died after



- 1 suffering from a disease known as toxoplasmosis, which is caused
- 2 by an infection with the feline-spread Toxoplasma gondii
- 3 parasite.
- 4 The legislature notes that feral cats can reproduce at an
- 5 alarming rate. It is estimated that one unspayed female cat and
- 6 her unaltered offspring can produce more than four hundred
- 7 thousand cats within seven years. Although counties may attempt
- 8 to control the feral cat population by euthanizing feral cats,
- 9 euthanasia does not address the problem of exponential increases
- 10 in the cat population. When cats from a colony are euthanized,
- 11 they leave a vacuum that is filled when other unsterilized cats
- 12 enter the same colony and start reproducing.
- 13 The legislature further finds that the trap-sterilize-
- 14 return process is not only more humane than euthanization, but
- 15 less costly. In the trap-sterilize-return process, animals are
- 16 caught in humane traps, sterilized so that they can no longer
- 17 reproduce, and surgically ear-tipped or ear-notched on one ear
- 18 so that they may be easily identified as sterilized. The
- 19 process may also include removing fleas and vaccinating the
- 20 animals. When sterilized cats are returned to their respective
- 21 colonies, unsterilized cats are less likely to take their place.

1	Thus, with the trap-sterilize-return process, colony populations
2	can reduce gradually over time.
3	The purpose of this Act is to promote the humane treatment
4	of feral cats and mongooses by:
5	(1) Requiring the department of health to contract with a
6	nonprofit animal rescue group to oversee caretakers of
7	feral cats and mongooses;
8	(2) Exempting registered caretakers of feral cats and
9	mongooses from state and county laws relating to the
10	feeding and confinement of cats and mongooses;
11	provided that the caretakers are registered with the
12	contracted rescue group; and
13	(3) Establishing a feral cat and mongoose trap-sterilize-
14	return process.
15	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
16	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
17	as follows:
18	"CHAPTER
19	FERAL CATS AND MONGOOSES
20	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the

21 context clearly requires otherwise:

1 "Caretaker" means a person who provides or attempts to 2 provide food and care to one or more feral cats or mongooses 3 within the State. 4 "Colony" means a group of feral cats or mongooses that 5 congregate and live together at a location within the State. 6 "Contracted rescue group" means the rescue group that has 7 entered into a contract with the department of health pursuant 8 to this chapter. 9 "Department" means the department of health. 10 "Feral cat" means a cat that is not: 11 (1) Owned by any person, or has been abandoned by its 12 owner; or 13 Confined by any person to any real property. (2) 14 "Registered caretaker" means a person who is registered as a caretaker pursuant to this chapter. 15 16 "Rescue group" means a society or organization that: 17 (1)Is incorporated and in good standing as a nonprofit 18 corporation pursuant to chapter 414D; 19 (2) Is incorporated for the purpose of providing shelter

to animals, promoting animal welfare, preventing

1		cruelty to animals, or a substantially similar
2		purpose;
3	(3)	Euthanizes or arranges to euthanize an animal only
4		after a licensed veterinarian has determined that:
5		(A) The animal is suffering from an injury, terminal
6		illness, or other health problem that severely
7		affects the animal's quality of life; and
8		(B) Euthanization is necessary to alleviate the
9		animal's suffering; and
10	(4)	Is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax
11		exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the
12		Internal Revenue Code.
13	"Tra	p-sterilize-return process" means a process that
14	includes	capturing a feral cat or mongoose, arranging for its
15	steriliza	tion, complying with other applicable standards, and
16	subsequen	tly releasing the feral cat or mongoose.
17	S	-2 Contracted rescue group responsibilities. By
18	January 1	, , the department shall contract with a rescue
19	group to:	
20	(1)	Register caretakers of feral cats and mongooses:

(2)	Maintain records of the names and contact information
	of registered caretakers;
(3)	Submit an annual report to the department that
	includes, at a minimum:
	(A) The number of registered caretakers;
	(B) The number of feral cats and mongooses captured
	by registered caretakers;
	(C) The location of each known colony; and
	(D) An estimate of the number of feral cats or
	mongooses in each known colony that have been
	sterilized;
(4)	Instruct and provide informational materials to each
	registered caretaker regarding the care of feral cats
	or mongooses, as applicable, and the trap-sterilize-
	return process;
(5)	Distribute humane animal traps to registered
	caretakers at no cost or at a reasonable cost;
(6)	Monitor registered caretakers' compliance with this
	chapter and any rules adopted under this chapter;

1	(7)	Revoke the registration of any caretaker who fails to
2		comply with this chapter or any rules adopted under
3		this chapter; and
4	(8)	Develop and distribute information and plan events to
5		educate the general public on the care of feral cats
6		and mongooses and the trap-sterilize-return process.
7	S	-3 Registered caretaker privileges. Notwithstanding
8	any other	law to the contrary, a registered caretaker shall be
9	exempt fr	om any state law or county ordinance that:
10	(1)	Prohibits or requires a permit for the feeding of
11		stray animals;
12	(2)	Mandates the confinement of cats or mongooses; or
13	(3)	Limits the number of animals that a person may own,
14		harbor, or have custody of;
15	provided	that this section shall not be construed to limit the
16	enforceme	nt of any law or ordinance prohibiting cruelty to
17	animals i	f enforcement is not solely based on the fact that the
18	registere	d caretaker is feeding feral cats or mongooses in a
10	nublic or	private legation

1	elects to	participate in the trap-sterilize-return process
2	shall:	
3	(1)	Use humane animal traps that, when in good working
4		order and used properly, do not cause harm to cats or
5		mongooses;
6	(2)	Not leave a set animal trap unattended for more than
7		four hours;
8	(3)	Not leave an animal trap unattended for more than a
9		reasonable time if the caretaker knows that the animal
10		trap contains a cat or mongoose;
11	(4)	Have each captured feral cat or mongoose sterilized by
12		a licensed veterinarian;
13	(5)	Have the left ear of each sterilized male feral cat
14		tipped or notched;
15	(6)	Have the right ear of each sterilized female feral cat
16		tipped or notched;
17	(7)	Have each sterilized mongoose appropriately marked in
18		a manner that signifies that the mongoose has been
19		sterilized;
20	(8)	Have each captured feral cat or mongoose:
21		(A) Evamined and treated for flee infestation, and

1		(B) Vaccinated from communicable diseases;
2	(9)	After following the procedures in paragraphs (4)
3		through (8), as applicable, return the cat or mongoose
4		to the location where the caretaker initially captured
5		the cat or mongoose; and
6	(10)	Maintain a log of the number of cats or mongooses, or
7		both, the caretaker has caused to complete the trap-
8		sterilize-return process, and submit a copy of the log
9		to the contracted rescue group not less than once per
10		month;
11	provided	that a caretaker shall not be required to comply with
12	paragraph	s (5) through (8) if compliance is cost-prohibitive.
13	(d)	A registered caretaker shall be exempt from any
14	requireme	nt of subsection (a) if the requirement would adversely
15	affect th	e health of a feral cat or mongoose or if a licensed
16	veterinar	ian determines that a feral cat or mongoose should be
17	euthanize	d because:
18	(1)	The animal is suffering from an injury, illness, or
19		other health problem that severely affects the
20		animal's quality of life; and

1	(2)	Euthanization is necessary to alleviate the animal's
2		suffering.
3	(c)	A registered caretaker shall comply with:
4	(1)	This chapter and rules adopted under this chapter; and
5	(2)	All state laws and county ordinances that prohibit
6		cruelty to animals.
7	S	-5 Rules. Not later than January 1, , the
8	departmen	t shall adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91, necessary
9	for the p	urposes of this chapter."

Description:

Requires the Department of Health to contract with a nonprofit animal rescue group to oversee caretakers of feral cats and mongooses. Exempts registered caretakers of feral cats and mongooses from state laws and county ordinances relating to the feeding and confinement of cats and mongooses. Establishes a trap-sterilize-return process.
