A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of aerial fireworks during celebrations continues to cause significant disruption and concern and a stronger deterrent is needed to curtail the use of illegal fireworks. According to the 2011 Report of the Illegal Fireworks Task Force to the Legislature for the Regular Session of 2011, increasing fines associated with illegal fireworks may act as a stronger deterrent.

8 SECTION 2. Section 132D-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

10 "(b) Except as provided in subsection (a) or as otherwise 11 specifically provided for in this chapter, any person violating 12 any other provision of this chapter, shall be fined not more 13 than [\$2,000] \$5,000 for each violation. Notwithstanding any 14 provision to the contrary in this section, any person violating 15 section 132D-14.5 shall be fined at least \$500 and no more than 16 [\$2,000.] \$5,000."
