A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGALIZED GAMBLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's
- 2 education and law enforcement sectors are being negatively
- 3 impacted by numerous teachers and police officers departing
- 4 because of low pay, lack of affordable housing, the high cost of
- 5 living, and the resulting need to work second jobs to feed their
- 6 families. The legislature further finds that a creative,
- 7 innovative, and resourceful plan of action is needed to generate
- 8 revenue for pay raises for teachers and police officers that
- 9 will allow these individuals to remain in the State without
- 10 sacrificing their quality of life.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to convene a task force within
- 12 the department of business, economic development, and tourism to
- 13 explore the feasibility of augmenting funding sources available
- 14 to pay teachers and police officers through revenues generated
- 15 by controlled legalized gambling, including offshore gambling
- 16 and a state lottery.

1	DEC1.	ion 2. (a) There is established a cask force within
2	the depar	tment of business, economic development, and tourism
3	for admin	istrative purposes to study the feasibility of
4	authorizi	ng controlled legalized gambling in the State,
5	including	offshore gambling and a state lottery system, as a
6	means of	generating revenue for pay raises for teachers and
7	police of	ficers. The study shall include but not be limited to:
8	(1)	Determining whether a public-private partnership could
9		be developed to strategically place two gambling
10		casinos in West Oahu without impacting the aloha
11		spirit and causing Hawaii to be viewed as a gambling
12		capital;
13	(2)	Evaluating whether a club card system could be
14		developed for controlled legalized gambling to ensure
15		the two casinos in West Oahu are the only sanctioned
16		gambling locations in the State apart from locations
17		authorized, if any, for a state lottery or offshore
18		gambling;
19	(3)	Evaluating the feasibility of establishing other forms
20		of legalized gambling in the State, including a state
21		lottery or offshore gambling;

1	(4)	Determining cost estimates and other implementation
2		requirements associated with legalizing gambling in
3		the State; and
4	(5)	Examining any other relevant information deemed
5		necessary by the director of business, economic
6		development, and tourism.
7	(b)	The task force shall consist of the following members:
8	(1)	A member designated by the president of the senate and
9		the speaker of the house of representatives, who shall
10		serve as the chairperson of the task force;
11	(2)	The director of business, economic development, and
12		tourism, or the director's designee;
13	(3)	The superintendent of education, or the
14		superintendent's designee;
15	(4)	A representative from the Honolulu police department;
16	(5)	A representative from the office of the mayor, city
17		and county of Honolulu;
18	(6)	A representative of the Hawaii State Teachers
19		Association;
20	(7)	A representative of the State of Hawaii Organization
21		of Police Officers;

1	(8) A representative of Hawaiian Airlines, Inc.;
2	(9) A representative from each of five largest casinos in
3	Las Vegas, Nevada, as determined by the chairperson of
4	the task force; and
5	(10) A representative of an area neighborhood board.
6	(c) Members of the task force shall serve without
7	compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses,
8	including travel expenses, incurred for service on the task
9	force. No member of the task force shall be made subject to
10	chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because of that
11	member's participation on the task force.
12	(d) The director of business, economic development, and
13	tourism, in consultation with the task force, shall submit a
14	report of the task force's findings and recommendations,
15	including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later
16	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
17	of 2022.
18	(e) The task force shall dissolve on June 30, 2022.
19	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

- much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 to
- carry out the purposes of this Act.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 3
- business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 5 this Act.

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- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 6
- provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2021. 7
