BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2	SECT	ION 1. Section 302A-604, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
3	amended to read as follows:		
4	"§302A-604 Complex area superintendents. The		
5	superintendent of education, with the approval of the board,		
6	shall appoint complex area superintendents for schools. <u>Complex</u>		
7	area superintendents for schools shall report directly to the		
8	superintendent of education. The complex area superintendents		
9	shall supervise the delivery of administrative and instructional		
10	support services within their respective complex areas,		
11	including:		
12	(1)	Personnel, fiscal, and facilities support;	
13	(2)	Monitoring of compliance with applicable state and	
14		federal laws;	
15	(3)	Curriculum development, student assessment, and staff	
16		development services; and	
17	(4)	Special education programs and special schools within	
18		the complex area."

2	SECT	ION 2. The department of education's office of	
3	informati	on technology services shall submit a report to the	
4	legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening of		
5	the regular session of 2022 with a detailed explanation of how		
6	the office of information technology services will be		
7	restructured in the next biennium to do the following:		
8	(1)	Improve support for information technology career and	
9		technical education programs;	
10	(2)	Improve visibility for information technology	
11		priorities and status of work and responsiveness to	
12		support requests from schools and complexes;	
13	(3)	Increase information technology support to schools and	
14		complexes;	
15	(4)	Increase functionality of online platforms for	
16		students, teachers, school administrators, families,	
17		and other end-users; and	
18	(5)	Create a feedback loop for end-users to submit their	
19		needs and requests to the office of information	
20		technology services with a clear timetable on follow-	
21		up.	




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1	SECTION 3. The department of education's office of		
2	strategy,	innovation, and performance shall submit a report to	
3	the legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening		
4	of the regular session of 2022 with a detailed explanation of		
5	how the office of strategy, innovation, and performance will be		
6	restructured in the next biennium to do the following:		
7	(1)	Determine the structural alignment of the offices and	
8		their branches;	
9	(2)	Restructure a plan to align the objectives of the	
10		different branches of the office of strategy,	
11		innovation, and performance to the requirements of	
12		federal and state regulations;	
13	(3)	Engage feedback from end-user groups such as complex	
14		area superintendents, schools, legislators, and board	
15		of education members;	
16	(4)	Realign the community engagement branch to appropriate	
17		offices within the department of education; and	
18	(5)	Provide an assessment of current staffing needs as it	
19		relates to the restructuring of the office of	
20		strategy, innovation, and performance.

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
