

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 29-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§29-14 Boards, etc., may accept funds, comply with		
4	federal acts. (a) Except as otherwise provided by law, any		
5	board, commission, department, or officer of the State may		
6	accept and receive on behalf of the State, and receipt for, any		
7	and all grants or allotments of federal-aid moneys made		
8	available to the State by or pursuant to an act of Congress, and		
9	enter into or make such plan, agreement, or other arrangement		
10	with the agency designated by the act of Congress as is		
11	necessary to carry out the purposes of the Act; provided that		
12	[if] <u>:</u>		
13	(1) If as a condition to receiving the federal-aid moneys		
14	it is necessary to match all or any part of the grant		
15	or allotment with state moneys no plan, agreement, or		
16	arrangement may be entered into unless the board,		
17	commission, department, or officer has under its or		

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1	the o	officer's control moneys [which] <u>that</u> may be	
2	exper	nded lawfully for the purpose[-]; and	
3	(2) The k	poard, commission, department, or officer of the	
4	State	e shall notify the president of the senate and the	
5	speal	ker of the house of representatives in writing of	
6	the	receipt of any grant or allotment of federal-aid	
7	money	ys no later than ten days following receipt.	
8	(b) The	governor may transfer funds from the department of	
9	health to the d	department of human services and from the	
10	department of h	numan services to the department of labor and	
11	industrial relations to obtain additional federal funds for		
12	medical assistance under Title XIX of the Social Security Act,		
13	as amended, and the work incentive program. The governor may		
14	also transfer funds from one department to another for the		
15	purpose of obtaining federal matching grants and allotments;		
16	provided that the state moneys have been appropriated for the		
17	purpose for which federal grants and allotments may be		
18	obtained."		
19	SECTION 2	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
20	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.

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Report Title:

Receipt of Federal Funds; Notification; House Speaker; Senate President

Description:

Requires the senate president and house speaker to be notified in writing upon the receipt of any federal-aid moneys for expenditure by the State within ten days following receipt.

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
