## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Section 302A-1106.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
3	is amended to read as follows:
4	"§302A-1106.5 Board of education; community [meetings.]
5	forums. [The board shall hold not less than one community
6	meeting annually in each county in In addition to their regular
7	meetings, the board shall hold no less than six community forums
8	annually to discuss and receive input from the community on
9	public education and public library issues [-]; provided that the
10	board shall hold at least one community forum in each county.
11	The board chairperson shall designate board members to attend
12	[the] each community [meetings.] forum. These community
13	[meetings] forums shall not be held for the purpose of
14	formulating educational policy. The community [meetings] forums
15	shall be [exempt from sections 92-2.5, 92-7, 92-9, and 92-41;
16	provided that the board shall give written public notice of each
17	community meeting. The meeting notice shall indicate the date,

1	(4) No commitment relating to a vote on a matter is made		
2	or sought at any community forum; and		
3	(5) At the next duly noticed meeting of the board, the		
4	board members shall report their attendance and the

7	SECTION 2. At any public meeting properly noticed pursuant		
8	to chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the board of education		
9	shall include an open forum at the end of its meeting agenda to		
10	afford all interested persons an opportunity to present oral		
11	testimony on any matter not on the agenda; provided that the		
12	testimony is related to matters over which the board of		
13	education has supervision, control, jurisdiction, or advisory		
14	power.		
15	SECTION 3. The board of education shall report to the		
16	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of		
17	the regular session of 2022 on its efforts to amend its policies		
18	to include an open forum at the end of its meeting agenda to		
19	afford all interested persons an opportunity to present oral		
20	testimony on any matter not on the agenda.

2	president of the University of Hawaii shall have one
3	vote.
4	Any decision to be reached by the applicable employer group
5	shall be [on the basis of] by a simple majority[ $\tau$ ] vote, except
6	when a bargaining unit includes county employees from more than
7	one county. In that case, the simple majority shall include at
8	least one county."
9	PART III
10	SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
11	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
12	begun before its effective date.
13	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

#### Report Title:

Board of Education; Public Meetings; Oral Testimony; Community Forums; Collective Bargaining; Voting

#### Description:

Requires the board of education to hold no less than six community forums annually, with at least one forum in each county. Requires the board to include an open forum for public comments on non-agenda items. Requires a report to the legislature on implementing open forums. Eliminates the superintendent of education as a voting member constituting the public employer for the purpose of negotiating a collective bargaining agreement with personnel of the department of education. Effective 7/1/2050. (Proposed SD1)
