A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FARM TO SCHOOL PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a key reason for the
- 2 creation of the Hawaii farm to school program in 2015 was to
- 3 improve the health of our keiki by encouraging their consumption
- 4 of fresh, locally grown foods, both for their nutritional
- 5 content and to promote healthy behaviors at an early age.
- 6 The legislature further finds that setting a target goal of
- 7 providing a fixed minimum percentage of locally sourced food in
- 8 public schools can bring the farm to school program closer to
- 9 achieving tangible results for the health of Hawaii's students,
- 10 including an increased consumption of fresh fruits and
- 11 vegetables and the potential to minimize diet-related diseases
- 12 in childhood, such as obesity and diabetes.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to establish a programmatic goal
- 14 that at least thirty per cent of food served in public schools
- will be locally sourced by 2030.

Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 4 5 and to read as follows: "\$302A- Farm to school meals. (a) To the extent 6 7 practicable, the department shall meet the local farm to school 8 meal goal that thirty per cent of food served in public schools 9 consist of locally sourced products by 2030. 10 For the purposes of this section: 11 "Fresh local agricultural products" means fruits, 12 vegetables, nuts, coffee, eggs, poultry and poultry products, livestock and livestock products, milk and milk products, 13 aquacultural and maricultural products, and horticultural 14 products that are one hundred per cent grown, raised, and 15 16 harvested in Hawaii. "Local value-added processed, agricultural, or food 17 products" means at least fifty-one per cent of the product's 18

primary agricultural product shall be grown, raised, and

harvested in Hawaii.

10	2022, con	taining the following information:
11	(1)	The status of the department's progress in meeting the
12		local farm to school meal goal;
13	(2)	The percentage of food served in public schools
14		consisting of locally sourced products, by county;
15	(3)	The costs associated with the farm to school meals
16		program and any savings realized;
17	(4)	A list of large purchases of locally sourced products
18		and the identity of the seller;
19	(5)	A list of meals on a school menu consisting of the
20		largest percentage of locally sourced products;

1	(6)	The percentage of fresh food served and the percentage
2		of processed food served, by county;
3	(7)	A description of the training conducted to prepare
4		cafeteria staff for cooking meals from scratch; and
5	(8)	The percentage of locally sourced products purchased
6		from the department's largest distributors."
7	SECT	ION 4. Section 141-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	repealed.
