A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FARM TO SCHOOL PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a key reason for the
 creation of the Hawaii farm to school program in 2015 was to
 improve the health of the State's keiki by encouraging
 consumption of fresh, locally grown foods, both for their
 nutritional content and to promote healthy behaviors at an early
 age.

7 The legislature further finds that setting a target goal of 8 providing a fixed minimum percentage of locally sourced food in 9 public schools can bring the farm to school program closer to 10 achieving tangible results for the health of Hawaii's students, 11 including an increased consumption of fresh fruits and 12 vegetables and the potential to minimize diet-related diseases 13 in childhood, such as obesity and diabetes.

14 The purpose of this Act is to move the Hawaii farm to
15 school program from the department of agriculture to the
16 department of education and establish a programmatic goal that
