## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LICENSING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 436B-14.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§436B-14.7 Licensure by endorsement or licensure by
4	reciprocity; initial acceptance by affidavit, temporary license;
5	military spouse. (a) [If a military spouse holds a current
6	license in another state, district, or territory of the United
7	States with licensure requirements that the licensing authority
8	determines are equivalent to or exceed those established by the
9	licensing authority of this State, that military spouse shall
10	receive a license pursuant to applicable statutes or
11	requirements of the licensing authority of this State regarding
12	licensure by endorsement or licensure by reciprocity; provided
13	that the military spouse:
14	(1) Has not committed an act in any jurisdiction that
15	would have constituted grounds for the limitation,
16	suspension, or revocation of a license; has never been
17	censured or had other disciplinary action taken; has

1		not had an application for licensure denied; or has
2		not refused to practice a profession or vocation for
3		which the military spouse seeks licensure;
4	<del>(2)</del>	Has not been disciplined by a licensing or
5		eredentialing entity in another jurisdiction; is not
6		the subject of an unresolved complaint, review
7		procedure, or disciplinary proceeding conducted by a
8		licensing or credentialing entity in another
9		jurisdiction; and has not surrendered membership on
10		any professional staff in any professional
11		association, society, or faculty for another state or
12		licensing jurisdiction while under investigation or to
13		avoid adverse action for acts or conduct similar to
14		acts or conduct which would constitute grounds for
15		disciplinary action in this State;
16	<del>(3)</del>	Pays any fees required by the licensing authority of
17		this State;
18	<del>(4)</del>	Submits with the application a signed affidavit
19		stating that application information, including
20		necessary prior employment history, is true and
21		accurate. Upon receiving the affidavit, if the

1		licensing authority issues the license to the military		
2		spouse, the licensing authority may revoke the license		
3		at any time if the information provided in the		
4		application is found to be false; and		
5	<del>(5)</del>	Is the spouse of a military member who is a member in		
6		good standing in the active or a reserve component of		
7		any of the armed forces of the United States and the		
8		military member has orders issued by the appropriate		
9		agencies of the armed forces to be stationed in Hawaii		
10		for a duration of at least one year.]		
11	Notwithst	anding any other law, a person who is married to an		
12	active du	ty member of the armed forces of the United States		
13	shall be	approved for licensure if the person:		
14	(1)	Is accompanying the member to an official permanent		
15		change of station to a military installation located		
16		in this State;		
17	(2)	Either holds a license in another jurisdiction as:		
18		(A) An accountant, an acupuncturist, an architect, an		
19		athlete agent, an athletic trainer, a behavior		
20		analyst, a dentist, a dispensing optician, an		
21		engineer, a hearing aid dealer and fitter, a		

1			marriage and family therapist, a certified nurse
2			aide, a licensed practical nurse, a registered
3			nurse, a nursing home administrator, an
4			occupational therapist, an optometrist, a
5			pharmacist, a naturopathic physician, an
6			osteopathic physician, a physician, a physician
7			assistant, a podiatrist, a psychologist, a real
8			estate appraiser, a respiratory therapist, a
9			social worker, a speech pathologist, an
10			audiologist, or a veterinary technician; or
11		<u>(B)</u>	The licensing authority for the disciplines not
12			included in subparagraph (A) has determined that
13			the licensure requirements of the other
14			jurisdiction are equivalent to or exceed those
15			established by the licensing authority of this
16			State;
17	(3)	Has	been licensed or certified by another jurisdiction
18		for	at least one year, and the license or
19		certification is in good standing and without	
20		cond	itions or restrictions in all jurisdictions in
21		whic	h the person holds a license or certification;

1	(4)	has met minimum education requirements and applicable
2		work experience and clinical supervision requirements
3		when licensed or certified by another jurisdiction,
4		and the other jurisdiction verifies that the person
5		met those requirements to become licensed or certified
6		in that jurisdiction;
7	(5)	Has passed the examination requirements for the
8		license or certification, if required by the licensing
9		authority of this State or another jurisdiction;
10	(6)	Has not had a license or certificate limited,
11		suspended, or revoked and has not voluntarily
12		surrendered a license or certificate in another
13		jurisdiction while under investigation for licensing
14		violations;
15	<u>(7)</u>	Has not had an application for licensure denied, been
16		censured, or had discipline imposed by another
17		licensing authority. If another jurisdiction has
18		taken disciplinary action against the person, the
19		licensing authority of this State shall determine if
20		the cause for the action was corrected and the matter
21		resolved. If the matter has not been resolved by that

1		jurisdiction, the licensing authority may not issue or		
2		deny a license applied for under this section until		
3		the matter is resolved;		
4	(8)	Does not have a complaint, allegation, or		
5		investigation pending before the licensing authority		
6		of another jurisdiction that relates to alleged		
7		conduct that, if substantiated, would be a licensing		
8		violation in this State. If an applicant has any		
9		complaints, allegations, or investigations pending,		
10		the licensing authority of this State shall suspend		
11		the application process and may not issue or deny a		
12		license applied for under this section until the		
13		complaint, allegation, or investigation is resolved;		
14	(9)	Has not surrendered membership on any professional		
15		staff in any professional association, society, or		
16		faculty for another jurisdiction while under		
17		investigation or to avoid adverse action for acts or		
18		conduct similar to acts or conduct that would		
19		constitute grounds for disciplinary action in this		
20		State;		
21	(10)	Pays all applicable fees;		

1	(11)	Does not have a disqualifying criminal history as
2		determined by the licensing authority; and
3	(12)	Submits with the application a signed affidavit
4		stating that the application information, including
5		necessary prior employment history, is true and
6		accurate. Upon receiving the affidavit, if the
7		licensing authority issues the license to the person,
8		the licensing authority may revoke the license at any
9		time if the information provided in the application is
10		found to be false or if the person fails to maintain
11		the conditions of initial licensure.
12	(b)_	A person who is licensed pursuant to this section is
13	subject t	o the laws regulating the person's practice in this
14	State and	is subject to the jurisdiction of the licensing
15	authority	of this State.
16	[ <del>-(b)</del>	] <u>(c)</u> The licensing authority shall issue to the
17	[ <del>military</del>	spouse] person a temporary license to allow the
18	[military	spouse] person to perform specified services, under
19	the super	vision of a professional licensed by this State if
20	appropria	te, while completing any requirements necessary for
21	licensure	in this State; provided that a temporary license shall

1 only be issued in those professions w	where credentials	
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- 2 experience, or passage of a national exam is substantially
- 3 equivalent to or exceed those established by the licensing
- 4 authority of this State.
- 5 [(c)] (d) The licensing authority shall expedite
- 6 consideration of the application and issuance of a license by
- 7 endorsement, license by reciprocity, or temporary license to a
- 8 [military spouse] person who meets the requirements of this
- 9 section.
- 10 [<del>(d)</del>] (e) A license [by endorsement or reciprocity] issued
- 11 under subsection (a) shall be valid for the same period of time
- 12 as a license issued pursuant to the requirements of title 25 for
- 13 the particular profession; provided that the total time period
- 14 that [a military spouse] the person holds a license issued [by
- 15 endorsement or reciprocity] under subsection (a) shall not
- 16 exceed five years in the aggregate."
- 17 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
