A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that health care services 2 are becoming complex and it is increasingly difficult for 3 patients to access integrated services. Quality of patient care 4 is jeopardized because of staffing changes implemented in 5 response to managed care. The legislature further finds that, to ensure the adequate 6 protection of patients in acute care settings, it is essential 7 8 that qualified registered nurses be accessible and available to 9 meet the needs of patients. The basic principles of staffing in 10 the acute care setting should be based on the patient's care 11 needs, the severity of condition, services needed, and the 12 complexity surrounding those services. 13 The purpose of this Act is to: 14

(1) Prohibit a hospital from assigning unlicensed assistive personnel to perform nursing care tasks, functions, and activities that would otherwise fall under the scope of practice of a registered nurse or

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1		permitting a registered nurse to delegate certain
2		tasks, functions, and activities to unlicensed
3		assistive personnel;
4	(2)	Prohibit registered nurses from being assigned to a
5		nursing unit or critical care area unless registered
6		nurses receive orientation and demonstrate individual
7		competency;
8	(3)	Require the department of health to adopt rules that
9		establish requirements related to registered nurse-to-
10		patient ratios in licensed hospitals; and
11	(4)	Require the department of health to submit a report to
12		the legislature.
13	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 321, part I, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
14	is amende	d by adding a new section to be appropriately
15	designate	d and to read as follows:

17	(a) A hos	spital licensed pursuant to this chapter shall not
18	assign un	licensed assistive personnel to perform nursing care

21	chapter 4	57. A hospital shall not permit a registered nurse to

18	(b)	No registered nurse shall be assigned to a nursing			
19	unit or o	clinical area unless that nurse has first received			
20	orientati	ion in that unit or area sufficient to demonstrate

3	(c)	No 1	ater than , the department shall adopt
4	rules pur	suant	to chapter 91 that establish minimum, specific,

7	shall inc	lude	requirements that:
8	(1)	Esta	blish the minimum number of registered nurses that

1	<u>(3)</u>	Provide flexibility for rural health centers, included
2		requests for a waiver from the requirements of this
3		section; provided that any waiver shall not jeopardize
4		the health, safety, and well-being of patients at the
5		rural health center;
6	(4)	Distinguish between regularly scheduled registered
7		nurse core staff in an emergency medical services
8		department and additional registered nurses providing
9		critical care services to patients in an emergency
10		medical services department;
11	<u>(5)</u>	Consider the unique needs of psychiatric patients
12		receiving care at a licensed hospital; and
13	<u>(6)</u>	Consider the unique nurse-to-patient ratios for
14		participants in a board-recognized nurse residency
15		program; provided that the department shall coordinate
16		with the board of nursing to establish requirements
17		pursuant to this paragraph.
18	<u>(d)</u>	Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection shall not
19	supersede	any existing registered nurse-to-patient ratio
20	requireme	nts that may be in place for:

1	(1)	The Hawaii state hospital or any facility operated by
2		the Hawaii health systems corporation; or
3	(2)	Intensive care units, neonatal intensive care units,
4		or operating rooms within a licensed hospital.
5	<u>(e)</u>	All hospitals shall adopt written policies and
6	procedure	s for training and mandatory orientation of nursing
7	staff.	
8	<u>(f)</u>	Except as provided by subsection (a), in the event of
9	a conflic	t between this section and any provision of chapter 457
10	or rules	adopted by the board of nursing pursuant to this
11	section,	chapter 457 and any rules adopted pursuant to that
12	chapter s	hall prevail.
13	(g)	The department shall submit a report to the
14	legislatu	re no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
15	the regul	ar session of 2026, on its efforts to comply with this
16	section,	including any proposed changes to the rules adopted
17	pursuant	to this section.
18	(h)	For purposes of this section:
19	<u>"Cri</u>	tical care unit" means a unit that is established to
20	safeguard	and protect patients whose severity of medical

- 1 conditions requires continuous monitoring and complex
- 2 intervention by registered nurses.
- 3 "Hospital unit" means a critical care unit, burn unit,
- 4 labor and delivery room, post-anesthesia service area, emergency
- 5 medical services department, operating room, pediatric unit,
- 6 stepdown or intermediate care unit, specialty care unit,
- 7 telemetry unit, general medical care unit, subacute care unit,
- 8 and transitional inpatient care unit."
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 457-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) [A] Except as provided in section 321- (a), a
- 12 registered nurse may delegate nursing care tasks, functions, and
- 13 activities to unlicensed assistive personnel in a manner that is
- 14 appropriate to the level of knowledge and skill of the
- 15 unlicensed assistive personnel; provided that the delegation of
- 16 tasks, functions, and activities complies with applicable
- 17 federal and state laws; and provided further that the practice-
- 18 pervasive functions of assessment, evaluation, and nursing
- 19 judgment shall not be delegated."
- 20 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

Report Title:

Nurses; Registered Nurses; Hospitals; Registered Nurse to Patient Ratios; Rules; Department of Health

Description:

Prohibits a hospital from assigning unlicensed assistive personnel to perform nursing care tasks, functions, and activities that would otherwise fall under the scope of practice of a registered nurse or permitting a registered nurse to delegate certain tasks, functions, and activities to unlicensed assistive personnel. Prohibits registered nurses from being assigned to a nursing unit or critical care area unless registered nurses receive orientation and demonstrate individual competency. Requires the department of health to adopt rules that establish requirements related to registered nurse-to-patient ratios in licensed hospitals. Requires a report to the legislature.

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
