A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BROADBAND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
as follows:
"CHAPTER
HAWAII BROADBAND OFFICE
<pre>\$ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:</pre>
"Broadband" means high-speed internet access that is always
on, including mobile and fixed technologies.
"Corporation" means the Hawaii technology development
corporation.
"Office" means the Hawaii broadband office.
<pre>\$ -2 Hawaii broadband office; establishment; state</pre>
<pre>broadband strategy officer; staff. (a) There is established</pre>
the Hawaii broadband office within the Hawaii technology
development corporation.
(b) The chief executive officer of the Hawaii technology
development corporation shall appoint a state broadband strategy

1	officer,	who shall be exempt from chapter 76, to head the
2	office.	The corporation shall employ any staff, who shall be
3	exempt fr	om chapter 76, as may be necessary for the purposes of
4	this chap	ter.
5	§	-3 Hawaii broadband office; duties. In furtherance of
6	the State	's objectives and policies for the economy pursuant to
7	section 2	26-10.5, the office shall:
8	(1)	Develop and implement specific strategies and plans to
9		aggressively increase broadband affordability,
10		penetration, and competitive availability in the
11		State;
12	(2)	Support the efforts of public and private entities in
13		Hawaii to enhance or facilitate the deployment of and
14		access to competitively priced, advanced electronic
15		communications services, including broadband and its
16		products and services and internet access services of
17		general application throughout Hawaii;
18	(3)	Promote the landing of the trans-Pacific submarine
19		cable, including the development of a shared access
20		cable station and associated terrestrial connectivity
21		to reduce barriers to fiber landing in Hawaii;

1	(4)	Promote, advocate, and facilitate the implementation
2		of the findings and recommendations of the Hawaii
3		broadband task force established by Act 2, First
4		Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2007; and
5	(5)	Actively seek out funding from private and public
6		sources in furtherance of the office's duties pursuant
7		to this chapter.

9	(a) The	office shall:
10	(1)	Seek input and the widest possible cooperation from
11		public and private agencies and individuals to achieve
12		the purposes of this chapter;
13	(2)	Promote coordinated broadband planning; and
14	(3)	To the extent feasible, incorporate the ideas and
15		suggestions of broadband stakeholders in the office's
16		planning directives.
17	(b)	Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to delegate
18	or detrac	t in any way from the functions, powers, and duties
19	conferred	by law or rule on any department or agency of the
20	State or	county."

20	counties	of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai, and the city and county of
21	Honolulu	by one or more appointed members. Except for the

1 [director of commerce and consumer affairs and the director of 2 business, economic development, and tourism, chief executive 3 officer of the Hawaii technology development corporation, all 4 members shall serve for a term of four years. Notwithstanding 5 any law to the contrary, the terms of all members as of July 1, 2016, shall expire on June 30, 2019; and, each subsequent four-6 7 year term shall commence on July 1, and expire on June 30 every 8 four years thereafter. Any member of the council whose term has expired may continue to serve as a holdover member until 10 reappointment or until a successor is appointed. Any vacancies 11 occurring in the membership of the advisory council shall be 12 filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same 13 manner as the original appointments. 14 The [director of commerce and consumer affairs] chief 15 executive officer of the Hawaii technology development 16 corporation, or the chief executive officer's designee, shall 17 serve as chairperson of the council. The chairperson may 18 designate representatives of other interested public or private 19 sector organizations to serve as members of the council, or as 20 members of the work groups of the council to address specified 21 issues on an ad hoc basis, as the chairperson deems necessary.
