A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BROADBAND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	HAWAII BROADBAND OFFICE
6	§ -1 Definitions . As used in this chapter:
7	"Broadband" means high-speed internet access that is always
8	on, including mobile and fixed technologies.
9	"Corporation" means the Hawaii technology development
10	corporation.
11	"Office" means the Hawaii broadband office.
12	§ -2 Hawaii broadband office; establishment; state
13	broadband strategy officer; staff. (a) There is established
14	the Hawaii broadband office within the Hawaii technology
15	development corporation.
16	(b) The chief executive officer of the Hawaii technology
17	development corporation shall appoint a state broadband strategy



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officer, who shall be exempt from chapter 76, to head the
 office. The corporation shall employ any staff, who shall be
 exempt from chapter 76, as may be necessary for the purposes of
 this chapter.

5 § -3 Hawaii broadband office; duties. In furtherance of
6 the State's objectives and policies for the economy pursuant to
7 section 226-10.5, the office shall:

8 (1) Develop and implement specific strategies and plans to
9 aggressively increase broadband affordability,
10 penetration, and competitive availability in the
11 State;

12 (2) Support the efforts of public and private entities in
13 Hawaii to enhance or facilitate the deployment of and
14 access to competitively priced, advanced electronic
15 communications services, including broadband and its
16 products and services and internet access services of
17 general application throughout Hawaii;

18 (3) Promote the landing of the trans-Pacific submarine
19 cable, including the development of a shared access
20 cable station and associated terrestrial connectivity
21 to reduce barriers to fiber landing in Hawaii;



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1	(4)	Promote, advocate, and facilitate the implementation
2		of the findings and recommendations of the Hawaii
3		broadband task force established by Act 2, First
4		Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2007; and
5	(5)	Actively seek out funding from private and public
6		sources in furtherance of the office's duties pursuant
7		to this chapter.
8	§	-4 Broadband planning and coordination; cooperation.
9	(a) The	office shall:
10	(1)	Seek input and the widest possible cooperation from
11		public and private agencies and individuals to achieve
12		the purposes of this chapter;
13	(2)	Promote coordinated broadband planning; and
14	(3)	To the extent feasible, incorporate the ideas and
15		suggestions of broadband stakeholders in the office's
16		planning directives.
17	(b)	Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to delegate
18	or detra	ct in any way from the functions, powers, and duties
19	conferred	d by law or rule on any department or agency of the
20	State or	county."



1 SECTION 2. Act 199, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, as 2 amended by section 5, Act 151, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, as 3 amended by section 2, Act 23, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, is 4 amended by amending section 3 to read as follows: 5 "SECTION 3. [Telework promotion; broadband assistance] 6 Broadband advisory council; establishment; purpose. (a) The 7 [director of commerce and consumer affairs] chief executive officer of the Hawaii technology development corporation, or the 8 9 chief executive officer's designee, shall convene and chair the 10 broadband [assistance] advisory council to advise the [director 11 of commerce and consumer affairs] chief executive officer of the 12 Hawaii technology development corporation on policy [and funding 13 priorities] to promote [and encourage use of telework 14 alternatives for public and private employees,] and expedite deployment of affordable and accessible broadband services in 15 16 Hawaii. 17 The council shall be composed of [the director of (b) 18 commerce and consumer affairs, or the director's designee; the 19 director of business, economic development, and tourism, or the 20 director's designee;] the chief executive officer of the Hawaii

21	Kauai, and	d the city and county of Honolulu by one or more

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1 appointed members. Except for the [director of commerce and 2 consumer affairs and the director of business, economic 3 development, and tourism,] chief executive officer of the Hawaii 4 technology development corporation, all members shall serve for 5 a term of four years. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, 6 the terms of all members as of July 1, 2016, shall expire on 7 June 30, 2019; and, each subsequent four-year term shall 8 commence on July 1, and expire on June 30 every four years 9 thereafter. Any member of the council whose term has expired 10 may continue to serve as a holdover member until reappointment 11 or until a successor is appointed. Any vacancies occurring in 12 the membership of the advisory council shall be filled for the 13 remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the 14 original appointments. 15 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the members 16 serving pursuant to paragraph (3) on the effective date of 17 Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, shall continue to serve the 18 remainder of their current terms. As vacancies occur, the 19 vacancies shall be filled in a manner that meets the composition 20 requirements of paragraph (3) as amended by Act , Session Laws 21 of Hawaii 2021.

19	broadband	office, including the establishment of two full-time
20	equivalen	t (2.00 FTE) positions that are exempt from chapter 76,
21	Hawaii Re	vised Statutes.



1	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
2	of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
3	of this Act.
4	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
