### A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 201-72.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	repealed.
3	[" <del>\$201-72.5 Aerospace advisory committee. (a) There is</del>
4	established an aerospace advisory committee within the office of
5	aerospace development of the department of business, economic
6	development, and tourism for administrative purposes. The
7	committee shall be composed of thirteen members appointed by the
8	governor, as provided in section 26-34, except as otherwise
9	provided in this section. Of the thirteen members:
10	(1) Three members shall be representatives of the
11	acrospace industry. One member shall be appointed
12	from a list of nominees submitted by the president of
13	the senate, and one member shall be appointed from a
14	list of nominees submitted by the speaker of the house
15	of representatives;
16	(2) Three members shall be representatives of the
17	acrospace industry in this State. One member shall be
18	appointed from a list of nominees submitted by the

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1	<del>president of</del>	the senate, and one member shall be
2	appointed fro	m a list of nominees submitted by the
3	speaker of th	e-house of representatives;
4	(3) Four members	shall represent the economic development
5	<del>boards of Kau</del>	ai, Oahu, Maui, and Hawaii, respectively,
6	<del>to be appoint</del>	ed, respectively, from a list of nominees
7	submitted by	each of these economic development
8	boards; and	
9	(4) Three members	shall represent the University of Hawaii

12	be appointed,	one each, from a list of nominees
13	submitted by	the University of Hawaii at Manoa,

16	The committee shall ele	et one of its members to serve as

18	(b) All members s	hall serve for a term of four years. Any
19	vacancies occurring in	the membership of the committee shall be
20	filled for the remainde	r of the unexpired term in the same
21	manner as the original	appointments.

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1	(c) The purpose of the aerospace advisory committee shall
2	be to advise and assist the legislature and state agencies in
3	monitoring, assessing, and promoting acrospace development
4	statewide by:
5	(1) Tracking state, national, and global trends and
6	priorities in aerospace development;
7	(2) Assisting in identifying and promoting opportunities
8	to expand and diversify aerospace development and
9	aerospace-related industries in this State;
10	(3) Supporting the office of aerospace development's
11	effort in networking with national and international
12	aerospace agencies, institutions, and organizations to
13	develop public-private partnerships to support the
14	growth of aerospace development and aerospace-related
15	industries in this State;
16	(4) Recommending innovative scientific, educational, and
17	economic strategies and government and education
18	policies to promote the growth and diversification of
19	the aerospace industry in this State; and
20	(5) Appointing temporary working groups, as deemed
21	appropriate in the committee's discretion, to assist
22	the office of aerospace development in research and

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1	analysis activities required to complete any report to
2	be submitted to the legislature and the governor by
3	the office of aerospace development.
4	(d) Members of the aerospace advisory committee shall
5	receive no compensation but shall be reimbursed for necessary
6	expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in the performance
7	of their duties as members of the committee.
8	(e) The committee shall convene for quarterly meetings in
9	the city and county of Honolulu; provided that any member who is
10	not a state resident may attend a meeting by teleconference.
11	(f) Administrative support to the committee, including the
12	development and dissemination of reports and advisory opinions,
13	shall be provided by the department of business, economic
14	development, and tourism."]
15	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken.
17	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
