A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY OFFICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 2 3 as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 HAWAII BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY OFFICE 6 § -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 7 context otherwise requires: 8 "Broadband" means high-speed internet access that is always 9 on, including mobile and fixed technologies. 10 "Department" means the department of business, economic 11 development, and tourism. 12 "Digital equity" means a condition in which all individuals 13 and communities have the information technology capacity needed 14 for full participation in society, democracy, and economy. 15 "Office" means the Hawaii broadband and digital equity 16 office.

10	In furtherance of the State's objectives and policies for the
11	economy pursuant to section 226-10.5, the office shall:
12	(1) Develop and implement specific strategies and plans to
13	aggressively increase broadband affordability,
14	penetration, and competitive availability in the
15	State;
16	(2) Support the efforts of both public and private
17	entities in the State to enhance or facilitate the
18	deployment of and access to competitively priced,
19	advanced electronic communications services, including
20	broadband and its products and services and internet

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I		access services of general application throughout the
2		State;
3	(3)	Promote the landing of trans-Pacific submarine cable,
4		including the development of a carrier-neutral cable
5		landing station and associated terrestrial
6		connectivity to reduce barriers to fiber landing in
7		Hawaii;
8	(4)	Promote, advocate, and facilitate implementation of
9		the findings and recommendations of the most current
10		Hawaii broadband strategic plan;
11	(5)	Support the findings of the community-based Broadband
12		Hui as reflected in its digital equity declaration;
13	(6)	Administer grant programs in support of broadband
14		infrastructure, innovation, and the digital economy;
15	(7)	Actively seek out funding from federal, private, and
16		other public sources in furtherance of the office's
17		duties pursuant to this chapter; and
18	e (8)	Provide a repository, aggregation point, and
19		governance framework for broadband mapping and digital
20		equity data from various sources including but not
21		limited to digital literacy, telehealth, distance

•			education, remote work, internet accessibility, and
2			service coverage to support mapping, reporting,
3			infrastructure deployment, and data-driven policy.

5	(a)	The	office shall:
6		(1)	Seek input and the widest possible cooperation from
7			public and private agencies and individuals to achieve
8			the purposes of this chapter;
9		(2)	Work closely with and assist the counties in the
10			promotion of coordinated state and county broadband
11			planning;
12		(3)	Encourage every state department, county agency, and
13			other public or private agencies and individuals
14			involved in broadband programs to participate in the
15			activities of the office and incorporate, to the
16			extent feasible, the ideas and suggestions of the
17			participants in the office's comprehensive planning
18			goals;
19		(4)	Monitor the broadband-based development efforts of
20			other states and nations in areas such as business,
21			education, and health;

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1	(5)	Advise the department on other states' best practices
2		involving remote work promotion and policies and
3		strategies related to making affordable broadband
4		services available to every home and business in the
5		State;
6	(6)	Monitor broadband-related activities at the federal
7		level;
8	(7)	Encourage public-private partnerships to increase the
9		deployment and adoption of broadband services and
10		applications;
11	(8)	Monitor regulatory and policy changes for potential
12		impact on broadband deployment and sustainability in
13		the State; and
14	(9)	Advise the director of business, economic development
15		and tourism on broadband deployment."
16	SECT	ION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.
