A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's aquatic 2 resources serve significant economic, ecologic, cultural, and 3 aesthetic importance such as to agriculture, tourism, food 4 production, and fisheries in the State. The legislature also 5 recognizes the importance of managing and conserving Hawaii's 6 aquatic resources and ecosystem for present and future 7 generations. Careful stewardship and protection of Hawaii's 8 aquatic resources are essential to the well-being of our island-9 state. 10 The purpose of this Act is to strengthen the penalties for violations of the State's aquatic resources law by: 11 12 (1)Specifying that any equipment, article, instrument, 13 aircraft, vehicle, vessel, or business record used in 14 violation of the aquatic resources law is subject to 15 forfeiture;

16 (2) Authorizing the imposition of a criminal fine;
